This amendment represents the recommendation of the Long-Range Planning Subcommittee to the House Appropriations Committee.

1. Changes the title for general fund transfers
2. Technical - corrects plural use of appropriation
3. Increases the appropriation that funds TSEP bridge and infrastructure projects and provides a biennial reference for clarity
4. Technical - corrects inaccurate use of appropriation
5. Eliminates the Beaverhead County bridge project at the request of the county
6. Adds the authorization for 11 bridge projects
7. Increases the Glendive waste water project
8. Eliminates the Custer County waste water project at the request of the county
9. Adds the authorization for 24 infrastructure projects
10. Adds reporting language which requires that program must report on grant recipients who have not been able to meet the start up conditions stated in the bill by 9/30/2014
11. Technical - corrects the "deadline" for grant recipients to meet their start-up conditions, per Department of Commerce
12. Increases the construction appropriation for the regional water program
13. Technical - adds a biennium reference for clarity
14. Transfers general fund to the TSEP and TSEP regional water programs to fund increased project amounts-total general fund transfers to HB 11 programs are \$22.5 million
