To whom it may concern,

My name is Doug Amsden . I am a Montana born native and a dependent disabled constituent of HD 55 living unemployed with a traumatic brain injury (TBI) sustained in a 1979 automobile accident. I asked my elected representative sent to Helena, MT to sponsor a timely revenue enhancement Bill to appropriate education program provisions in constructive rehabilitation dialogue and generate education resource accommodations in disabled constituency rehabilitation services employment options. My elected representative instead refused to sponsor this enhancement bill which would have served to sustain traumatic brain injury disabled individual income earning rights in culture employment options. He discriminated against people outside the party who want to be productive citizens contributing to society and not be faced with frustration trying to work alongside a government system that is wrought with structural waste, fraud and abuse.

Upon hearing from my representative that he would not sponsor my Bill, I testified then before the January 25, 2013 Health and Human Services Appropriations Subcommittee first on my being "offended" by culture bias when my elected representative chose not to sponsor this Bill on January 26<sup>th</sup> 2013. I further expressed to the appropriations subcommittee that was open for testimony on the subject of sponsoring public elementary Revenue enhancement provisions about the crisis facing disabled constituency rehabilitation employment, job training, and sustainable income earning options on education principle would help similar displaced people like me achieve our goals for success. But I expressed my objection before the committee on being discriminated by untimely and outdated Montana government rehabilitation policy division standards.


