



Percent of Population 65 Years and Older in Montana





- Since 1990, the 85 and older population in Yellowstone County has been increasing approximately 6.8% annually; the overall population for Yellowstone County has been increasing approximately 1.5% annually.

This growth trend in the County's older population will not only continue but is anticipated to accelerate as baby boomers "age in place" and older adults migrate to Billings because of healthcare and other services.
