4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING THE DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS RAISED BY THE  
5 VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL MILL LEVY IN CERTAIN COUNTIES TO SUPPORT INSTITUTIONS IN THOSE  
6 COUNTIES; AMENDING SECTIONS 20-9-212 AND 20-25-439, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9  
10 **Section 1.** Section 20-9-212, MCA, is amended to read:

11 **"20-9-212. Duties of county treasurer.** The county treasurer of each county:

12 (1) must receive and shall hold all school money subject to apportionment and keep a separate  
13 accounting of its apportionment to the several districts that are entitled to a portion of the money according to the  
14 apportionments ordered by the county superintendent or by the superintendent of public instruction. A separate  
15 accounting must be maintained for each county fund supported by a countywide levy for a specific, authorized  
16 purpose, including:

- 17 (a) the basic county tax for elementary equalization;
- 18 (b) the basic county tax for high school equalization;
- 19 (c) the county tax in support of the transportation schedules;
- 20 (d) the county tax in support of the elementary and high school district retirement obligations; and
- 21 (e) any other county tax for schools, including the community colleges, that may be authorized by law  
22 and levied by the county commissioners.

23 (2) whenever requested, shall notify the county superintendent and the superintendent of public  
24 instruction of the amount of county school money on deposit in each of the funds enumerated in subsection (1)  
25 and the amount of any other school money subject to apportionment and apportion the county and other school  
26 money to the districts in accordance with the apportionment ordered by the county superintendent or the  
27 superintendent of public instruction;

28 (3) shall keep a separate accounting of the receipts, expenditures, and cash balances for each fund;

29 (4) except as otherwise limited by law, shall pay all warrants properly drawn on the county or district  
30 school money;



1 (5) must receive all revenue collected by and for each district and shall deposit these receipts in the fund  
2 designated by law or by the district if a fund is not designated by law. Interest and penalties on delinquent school  
3 taxes must be credited to the same fund and district for which the original taxes were levied.

4 (6) shall send all revenue received for a joint district, part of which is situated in the county, to the county  
5 treasurer designated as the custodian of the revenue, no later than December 15 of each year and every 3  
6 months after that date until the end of the school fiscal year;

7 (7) at the direction of the trustees of a district, shall assist the district in the issuance and sale of tax and  
8 revenue anticipation notes as provided in Title 7, chapter 6, part 11;

9 (8) shall register district warrants drawn on a budgeted fund in accordance with 7-6-2604 when there  
10 is insufficient money available in all funds of the district to make payment of the warrant. Redemption of registered  
11 warrants must be made in accordance with 7-6-2116, 7-6-2605, and 7-6-2606.

12 (9) when directed by the trustees of a district, shall invest the money of the district within 3 working days  
13 of the direction;

14 (10) each month, shall give to the trustees of each district an itemized report for each fund maintained  
15 by the district, showing the paid warrants, registered warrants, interest distribution, amounts and types of revenue  
16 received, and the cash balance;

17 (11) shall ~~remit promptly to the department of revenue~~ transfer to the 2-year postsecondary institution  
18 in the county receipts for the county tax for a vocational-technical program within a unit of the university system  
19 when levied by the board of county commissioners under the provisions of 20-25-439;

20 (12) shall invest the money received from the basic county taxes for elementary and high school  
21 equalization, the county levy in support of the elementary and high school district retirement obligations, and the  
22 county levy in support of the transportation schedules within 3 working days of receipt. The money must be  
23 invested until the working day before it is required to be distributed to school districts within the county or remitted  
24 to the state. Clerks of a school district shall provide a minimum of 30 hours' notice in advance of cash demands  
25 to meet payrolls, claims, and electronic transfers that are in excess of \$50,000, pursuant to 20-3-325. If a clerk  
26 of a district fails to provide the required 30-hour notice, the county treasurer shall assess a fee equal to any  
27 charges demanded by the state investment pool or other permissible investment manager for improperly noticed  
28 withdrawal of funds. Permissible investments are specified in 20-9-213(4). All investment income must be  
29 deposited, and credited proportionately, in the funds established to account for the taxes received for the  
30 purposes specified in subsections (1)(a) through (1)(d).

1 (13) shall remit on a monthly basis to the department of revenue, as provided in 15-1-504, all county  
2 equalization revenue received under the provisions of 20-9-331 and 20-9-333, including all interest earned, in  
3 repayment of the state advance for county equalization prescribed in 20-9-347. Any funds in excess of a state  
4 advance must be used as required in 20-9-331(1)(b) and 20-9-333(1)(b)."

6 **Section 2.** Section 20-25-439, MCA, is amended to read:

7 **"20-25-439. Vocational-technical education -- mill levy required.** (1) Subject to 15-10-420, the boards  
8 of county commissioners of Cascade, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, Silver Bow, and Yellowstone Counties shall  
9 in each calendar year levy a tax of 1 1/2 mills on the dollar value of all taxable property, real and personal, located  
10 within the respective county.

11 (2) The funds from the mill levy must be ~~deposited in the general fund and must be distributed for~~  
12 ~~vocational-technical education on the basis of budgets approved by the board of regents~~ transferred by the county  
13 treasurer to the 2-year postsecondary institution in the county and used by the institution for local initiatives  
14 benefiting residents of the county consistent with the institutional mission approved by the board of regents.  
15 Proposed uses of the funds must be approved by the board of regents."
