Description of fiscal impact: HB 81 allows the Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists to offer a barbering nonchemical license. There will be a minor fiscal impact in FY 2016 for rule-making to implement the addition of the new license type.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. This legislation will allow schools of barbering and cosmetology, approved by the board, to teach non-chemical barbering, and will allow the board to issue non-chemical barbering licenses to qualified applicants.
2. The board will write or update administrative rules to implement this legislation. It is estimated there will be a 10 page rule notice and three page adoption notice. The board will hold a public with a Hearing Officer presiding and a Court Reporter present to transcribe public comment. The board has 70 interested parties; 34 require notice by postal service, 36 by email. Those requiring notice by mail will be notified by postcard and directed to the board's website to review the full context of the rule notice. It is estimated the board will
