Description of fiscal impact: The fiscal impact of HB 186 is unknown.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. HB 186 revises laws related to protecting victims of sexual offenses and requires sentencing judges to order an offender to refrain from contacting a victim of a sexual offense or an immediate family member of the victim, if requested by the victim or immediate family member.
2. Section 3 of HB 186 requires the Department of Corrections to request a hearing with a sentencing judge to ask that the conditions of probation include requiring the probationer to refrain from contact with the victim of the offense or an immediate family member of the victim if the victim or family member requests such.
3. The number of district court hearings may increase as a result of HB 186; however, the Judicial Branch is unable to estimate the impact on judicial workload or the fiscal impact. Over time, the cumulative impact of such legislation may eventually require additional judicial resources because court dockets currently are full in many judicial districts throughout the state.
