Description of fiscal impact: HB 332 allows cost reimbursements associated with pre-commitment psychiatric detention, examination and treatment to be collected from the county that filed the petition for commitment. Currently, the county of residence of the person who is suffering from a mental disorder is billed first. As HB 332 does not change the ability of an entity to bill another entity for expenses incurred in taking a committed person to a facility, there is no fiscal impact to the state.
