Description of fiscal impact: SB 60 revises indecent exposure laws, provides for penalties, and revises sexual offender registry provision related to the offense of indecent exposure. The fiscal impact of SB 60 cannot be reasonably determined.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Corrections

- SB 60 amends the existing indecent exposure statute to include making it a felony if the age of the victim is less than 16 years old and the offender is 18 years of age or older. There is no data available for this new felony as currently the victims' ages aren't documented.
- SB 60 makes "indecent exposure" a sex offense that would require the offender to register as a sex offender as part of the Sexual or Violent Offender Registration Act.
- Due to the lack of data, the fiscal impact of SB 60 cannot be reasonably determined. However, for informational purposes, if a person is convicted of a felony under this new language, the cost of incarceration is \$34,175 per year per male inmate and \$38,515 per year per female inmate.

Judicial Branch

4. The number of district court cases may increase as a result of this legislation; however, the Judicial Branch is unable to estimate the impact on judicial workload or the fiscal impact. The cumulative impact of such legislation may eventually require additional judicial resources because court dockets currently are full in many judicial districts throughout the state.

Office of the Public Defender (OPD)


5. OPD has the statutory obligation to represent individuals charged with a crime who cannot afford to hire counsel, represent individuals on direct appeal and also to provide counsel if there is a conflict of interest.
6. Due to the lack of data, the fiscal impact of SB 60 cannot be reasonably determined.
