### FISCAL ANALYSIS

**Assumptions:**

- SB 102 provides that persons who register their emitting activities in lieu of obtaining a permit must pay a fee to fund the department's administrative cost.
- Facilities that choose to register would pay registration fees in lieu of paying permit fees.
- SB 102 does not have a fiscal impact because it does not allow the department to collect more fee revenue from entities that are subject to air fees or expand the air quality regulatory authority of the department.
