Description of fiscal impact: SB 357 has an unknown fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- SB 357 would include criminal child endangerment as defined in 45-5-628(1)(e), MCA, as a prior offense in determining whether to charge an individual with a felony DUI offense.
- There were 15 people convicted of criminal child endangerment under 45-5-628(1)(e), MCA, in the past year.
- The number of prior DUI convictions for the 15 people convicted of criminal child endangerment under 45-5-628(1)(e), MCA, is unknown.
- The number of future convictions under 45-5-628(1)(e), MCA, when a person has a combination of three or more prior convictions as currently listed in 61-8-731, MCA, is unknown.
- If a person is convicted of a felony under this new language, the cost of incarceration is \$34,175 per year per male inmate and \$38,515 per year per female inmate.
