Description of fiscal impact: SB 365 allows an existing all-beverage licensee the ability to apply for additional licenses through the liquor lottery process as long as they do not hold more than two existing licenses. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

Department of Revenue (DOR)

1. Current law allows an individual to own up to three all-beverage licenses. However, current law allows individuals that do not own an all-beverage license to apply for a license through the liquor lottery process but it does not allow an existing license holder to apply for additional licenses through the lottery process.
2. SB 365 amends 16-4-204, MCA, to allow individuals that already own a license the ability to apply for an additional license through the liquor lottery process.
3. This bill would require minor form changes. There are no costs to the DOR.
