Chairman Berry:

It has come to my attention that Northwest MedStar, a proponent of HB 177—a bill heard before the House Business & Labor Committee last Thursday to remove from Montana Code the requirement that an air ambulance service be licensed in Montana for two years before it can sell memberships—claimed I misled the Committee during my testimony against the bill.

I want to set the record straight and request, with the Chair's permission, that this message be distributed to the Committee prior to executive action on the bill.

The intent of my testimony and the fact sheet I distributed to the committee was to establish a proponent of the bill (Northwest MedStar)—though licensed to operate in Montana—has not followed through with the statute's requirement that an air ambulance service provider be licensed in Montana for two years before it can sell memberships. There is clearly a distinction between licensure to operate and licensure to sell memberships.

Please accept my apology if my testimony was not clear on this distinction. It was certainly not my intention to create any confusion over the issue.
