

**SB 401: The boxing community and the Dept of Labor have worked together to develop a system that brings the Boxing Commission to solvency (regulating program) and allows there to be sanctioned pro-boxing events in MT. This is how:**

**Designee:**

The Department of Labor will certify volunteers. Volunteers will have an extensive experience in boxing.

Duties include

Accept documents

Vet contestants

Issue licenses

Supervise weigh-ins

Inspect gloves and hand wraps

**Regulations:**

All blood work within one year.

---All amateur boxers including the Olympics do not do blood testing.

---There are several other commissions that accept blood work within one year including, Washington, Colorado, New York, Oklahoma ect.

Physicals may be done by the ringside physician.

Security will be determined by the venue holder and or the promoter.

Glove condition will be determined by the volunteer.

**Increase fees:**

As requested by the Department of Labor, current gate fees will be eliminated as they are based on a percentage of the gate. This bill replaces that with a set fee for predictability purposes. All fees will be in rules.

**Allow for contributions:**

SB 401 will allow for contributions to be made from the private sector and this will help with solvency.
