

1. Neonatal Law
  - a. Legislation for politically correct language
  - b. Creating new definition of "person" for the law, dictionaries and science books.
2. Statute of Limitations
  - a. Deliberate, mitigated, or negligent homicide have no statute of limitations, so:
  - b. Must prosecute women and conspirators (e.g. boyfriends, parents, doctors) who have committed deliberate homicide (abortion), mitigated homicide (miscarriage), or negligent homicide (miscarriage dues to improper prenatal -care)
  - c. Must investigate conspiracies to commit murder, e.g. parents and child leave state to abort
    - i. Must incarcerate known offenders and revoke their rights
    - ii. Offenders must report their criminal record on job applications
  - d. Must subpoena the records of physicians, nurses, pharmacists who distribute dangerous drugs which end the life of the person
3. Immigration Law
  - a. US citizenship when sperm enters egg
  - b. Importing sperm and eggs to Montana, in vitro fertilizations and exporting U.S. citizens
  - c. How will we regulate the business of insemination vacations? Passports needed for person?
4. Business Law
  - a. Adjust job discrimination laws because fewer women will be in the workforce
  - b. Eliminates competition from women (who are smarter and have better skills than many men) gives men the hand ups we need to make better wages to support our families
5. Fertility Inspections and regulations
  - a. Upon entering and exiting the state
    - i. Inspecting incoming women at the border for recent sexual history and pregnancy status
    - ii. Quarantining outgoing women at the border to make sure they are permitted to transport a person out of state and follow up on the status of the person through birth. i.e. we don't want women taking persons out of state to murder them.
  - b. Continuous monitoring for fertility and impregnation events to verify compliance with the law
    - i. Fertility registration and inspection begins at first menstruation.
6. Castle Doctrine – holding body hostage, stealing food, health, etc.
  - a. Does a woman have the right to defend herself against someone taking possession of their body?
7. Legal Consequence of State Sponsored Forced Breeding Program
  - a. Because a woman is forced to give birth by the state, can she relinquish the person's care to the state?
  - b. If so, legally at moment of conception the State is responsible for the care of the person.
  - c. New institutions are needed for State adoptions and State-run orphanages for care of person.
8. Landlord Tenant Law – person as intrauterine tenant
  - a. What are the laws of tenants who occupy your premises for 9 months without paying rent?
  - b. Would these laws apply to all landlord/tenant transactions?
9. State versus Freedom of Religion
  - a. Soul enters person as sperm enters egg. Aborted persons are pure spirits, more holy than angels, who, at the feet of God, pray for their parents continuously and welcome them to heaven.
  - b. Restricting abortion decreases the number of pure spirits in heaven available to intercede on the parent's behalf, putting the parent's eternal life at risk.
