

BIOGRAPHY

My early years growing up on our grain and cattle farm instilled in me a love of the land, growing things, and open space that has become the guiding core of my life. Add to that a solid Democrat and Farmers Union upbringing and my political viewpoints were well established. In the early 80's my parents offered Hugo and I an opportunity to come back to the farm. At that time a part of the farm had been sold and the machinery was out dated due to the land being leased out. We had a good life established with he as a university professor and my research background. But we decided to do it. It wasn't easy. Hugo had to start with trying to get old machinery running. I became the paper manager. With a lot of hard work, help from my parents, luck and risk management, and the fact that at that time one could make land pay for itself, we managed to rebuild our "place" into a sustainable operating unit. Thirty-five years have passed. We now have a son and his wife and a daughter on the farm with us.

I have experience in all levels of farm operating record keeping and accounting, including Farm Service Agency Programs, cattle and grain inventories and sales, financial statements, land contracts, crop insurances, farm liability and fleet insurances, and survival computer skills.
