


Montana

Reducing Total Patient Harm by over 75%.








Colorado Hospitals Reduce Harm by 31.1% Over 2.5 Years





Current Total Harm Reduction excluding Readmissions


Total Harm Per 1,000 Patient Days


Total Harm Per 1,000 Patient Days

North Dakota


Total Harm Per 1,000 Patient Days



The Total Harm per 1000 Patient Days run chart reflects progress based on 11 top aligned measures over a 26-month time period. North Dakota's baseline rate is 20.2 harms (including preventable readmissions) per 1000 patient days. Based on the most recent three months in this time period, the overall harm reduction rate is 24%.












From Jan-12 to Jul 14, SDAHO/HRET hospitals have prevented 697 harms and saved an estimated \$2,954,434
