



EXPERIENCE

Director of Aviation and Professor, Rocky Mountain College (May 03 – present)

- Directs aviation program for over 100 undergraduate students in 4-year baccalaureate program, offering degrees in Aeronautical Science (Professional Pilot) and Aviation Management. Responsible for curriculum development, accreditation, recruiting, retention, 27 employees and \$750,000 annual budget
- Oversees direction of FAA-approved Part 141 Flight School, with eight aircraft, three mechanics, and 12 flight instructors, flying over 4000 hours per year in 15 different syllabi. Ensures standardization and quality of training, regulatory compliance, safety, and career development
- Leader of accreditation self study for both aviation majors—wrote self-study and hosted accreditation visiting team from the Aviation Accreditation Board International. Both aviation majors were accredited in 2009 and re-accredited in 2014
