For the record my name is John Tubbs, Director of the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation. I stand in opposition of Senate Bill No. 215. SB 215 would limit the Land Board from exercising the Board's constitutional responsibility over the disposition of land owned by the State of Montana. Article X of the Constitution states: "Any public land may be exchanged for other land, public or private, which is equal in value and, as closely as possible, equal in area."

Before we even get to the question of future sale of lands acquired from the federal government, you need to understand we cannot predict the conditions of a future grant to the state of federal lands. We have seen a variety of land grants from Congress and it is not beyond the possibility that a future grant may require the State to sell a portion of or all of the granted lands. Again the Constitution is specific on this point "No land which the state holds by grant from the United States which prescribes the manner of disposal and minimum price shall be disposed of except in the manner and for at least the price prescribed without the consent of the United States."

Senate Bill 215 could be read in a way that will stop nearly all sales of state land, since nearly all state lands were originally granted from the Federal Government. However, if you read SB 215 as I understand the sponsor intended, SB 215 creates a special class of land for the future; a class of lands that could never be sold once acquired. A strict ban prohibiting future sales fails to recognize that over time circumstances change.

Montana's state lands are not a static resource. The Land Board considers the sale and purchase of land at nearly every monthly meeting. I attached the 2015 Land Banking Report the Department provides Environmental Quality Council each interim. In the report you will see that since 2006 the state has sold 66,180 acres and has purchased 64,629 acres. All 66,180 acres sold were originally granted to the state by the federal government.

I would point to three of the purchases listed in report to emphasize the goal of the Land Board to improve access to public lands. The Tongue River Ranch, 18,544 acres was purchased in 2007. The Ranch is located 30 miles south west of Miles City and provides access to an incredible diversity of desirable wildlife for the public. The North Swan lands purchased in 2010 includes 16,544 acres of Plumb Creek Timber Lands. This purchase allowed the Department to consolidate a checkerboard ownership pattern and put together a transportation plan that not only gains access to these 16.5 thousand acres, but provides access to the adjacent US Forest Service lands. The Chamberlain Creek purchase is 14,581 acres located near Clearwater Junction on Highway 200. Again the state blocked up lands that are accessible to the public.

None of these land purchases would have been allowed if SB 215 was current law because the source of much of the revenue used to make the purchases was generated through the sale of lands granted to the state by the federal government.

In this session and in the previous two session, the legislature has considered legislation directing the Department to sell lands leased for cabin sites. If a future transfer of federal lands includes cabin site leases, these cabin sites could never be sold if SB 215 is enacted. Given the difference in lease

rates between the Federal and State governments, I am confident any cabin site lease owners would ask that the state sell these parcels rather than bring them into the state system.

SB 215 would unnecessarily restrict the future management of federal lands acquired by the state. This is not theoretical; the state is actively working with BLM on acquisition of federal lands. The State and the BLM have identified 1,180 acres of "in-lieu of" lands. These remnant acres were not transferred to the State with the other school sections due to a prior federal reserve. It is expected that a final list of BLM replacement lands will be identified within a year.

I believe the Department will do a good job negotiating the transfer of federal lands that it will result in long-term revenues for the trust beneficiaries and increase public access. However, the decisions we make in the next year may not be perfect for all time. A land board in 2050 may find an opportunity to consolidate lands that brings even greater returns or provides improved access to public lands. SB 215 would deny the future Land Board this opportunity.

The Land Board's ability to sell, purchase, enter into long-term leases and provide for special uses should not be limited nor should there be a special class of lands created within all other state lands. SB 215 does just that by forbidding any future sale of acquired federal lands. SB 215 may be well intentioned but the result will be to eventually limit future benefits and opportunities for the Land Board to improve access to our public lands.

Montana Constitution Article X. Section 11. Public land trust, disposition. (1) All lands of the state that have been or may be granted by congress, or acquired by gift or grant or devise from any person or corporation, shall be public lands of the state. They shall be held in trust for the people, to be disposed of as hereafter provided, for the respective purposes for which they have been or may be granted, donated or devised. (2) No such land or any estate or interest therein shall ever be disposed of except in pursuance of general laws providing for such disposition, or until the full market value of the estate or interest disposed of, to be ascertained in such manner as may be provided by law, has been paid or safely secured to the state. (3) No land which the state holds by grant from the United States which prescribes the manner of disposal and minimum price shall be disposed of except in the manner and for at least the price prescribed without the consent of the United States. (4) All public land shall be classified by the board of land commissioners in a manner provided by law. Any public land may be exchanged for other land, public or private, which is equal in value and, as closely as possible, equal in area.

LAND BANKING REPORT
January 2015

Background:

HB 223 (77-2-361 through 367, MCA) passed the Legislature in 2003 with bipartisan support, including unanimous support from the Land Board. HB 223 enacted a Land Banking program whereby the proceeds of trust land sales would be placed in a special land banking account which could only be used to acquire other real property interests (land, easements, or improvements). In 2009 the Legislature passed HB 402, removing the sunset and capping the number of acres that could be sold through Land Banking at 250,000.

Statute requirements:

- Limits sale of land to 250,000 acres
 - 75% of the 250,000 acres must be isolated land
 - Limits sales to 20,000 acres until replacement properties were purchased
- Replacement land must generate as much or more revenue than the land sold
- The Department is required to provide a report to the Environmental Quality Council prior to each regular legislative session, which describes the results of the Land Banking program in detail.

Goals of the program:

- Increase public access to state trust land
 - 181,768 acres have been nominated for sale
 - 66,180 acres have been sold, 84% were isolated
 - 64,629 acres have been purchased, all are legally accessible with recreational opportunities
- Improve the investment portfolio of the beneficiaries by diversifying land holdings
 - lands sold generated \$193,830 annually
 - lands acquired generated \$330,373 annually
 - lands sold are predominately isolated grazing lands (84%) and the lands acquired include agricultural, grazing and timbered lands
- Enhance management and stewardship activities with land consolidation
 - lands acquired are contiguous and in most cases consolidate existing state ownership

Milestones:

- A Negotiated Rulemaking process was approved by the Board of Land Commissioners in June 2004, and the Committee was initiated in October 2004.
- Administrative Rules (ARM 36.25.801 through 817) were given final approval by the Board of Land Commissioners in September 2005. Rules have been amended to reflect 2007 statutory changes.
- **657** parcels containing **181,768** acres have been nominated for sale since program inception. Processed and sold **66,180** acres of land consisting of **311** parcels. **55,345** acres were isolated (84%), while **10,835** acres were legally accessible (16%).
- Agency is currently processing 13,531 acres of land for sale; 11,059 isolated (82%); 2,472 legally accessible (18%).
- **64,629** legally accessible acres in **15** acquisitions have been purchased.
- Income generated annually from parcels purchased (\$330,373), has increased trust revenues \$136,543 or 70% over income generated from parcels sold.

LAND BANKING SALES CLOSED

Land Banking Rules require a rigorous examination of trust land prior to sale, including evaluation using the Montana Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) process, appraisal, notification of lessees, beneficiaries, adjacent landowners, licensees, publication of legal notices, culminating in public auctions after which final Board approval is required.

LAND BANKING ACQUISITIONS

Criteria for tracts acquired:

- Increasing rate of return compared with the land sold.
- Improving access and consolidating land holdings.
- Maintaining a similar land base consistent with the state's fiduciary duty.
- Considering equalization of land base through sales and acquisitions by geographic area.

The following table summarizes replacement property acquired with Land Banking proceeds.

Note that while **66,180** acres were sold generating **\$35,566,649** in sales revenue, the state has acquired **64,629** acres while spending **\$31,225,783**. Additionally, the replacement acreage is all publicly accessible, while producing more than twice the rate of return to the beneficiaries.

I encourage you to support SB 268 to further protect our aquifer when the water table may be intersected by pollutants such as storm drains or septic systems. There are areas within our Target Range/Orchard Homes neighborhoods where the water table is high, even less that 6-8 feet at some times of the year. I believe the Health Dept. is paying attention to this situation in terms of septic permits for new construction, but it is also important for storm drains and other concentrated run off to be kept from directly intercepting our water table. Sonja –

At this Monday's hearing, I believe it was either Senator Fielder or Chairman Vincent who asked me to provide information as to implementation of the Farm Bill in Montana by the Forest Service. Could you please share the following information with them as well as the other committee members? The information below came from the folks in my regional office who administer the timber program across the Region.

*All of the B-D, Bitterroot, **Most of the Custer-Gallatin**, Flathead, Helena-Lewis/Clark, Kootenai and Lolo timber sales or stewardship contracts are within the Sec. of Agriculture's Designated Insect & Disease areas for the Fiscal year 15 program.... we can only give you an estimate of acres as many of the sales have yet to be sold. Estimates are probably on the conservative side. Volumes are more accurate and represent what each Forest displayed on their periodic sale announcement:*

- *FY 15 project acreage and volume total within Designated I & D areas under the Farm Bill: 17,000 acres; Volume approximately: 130 MMBF (million board feet)*
- *FY 16 Farm Bill Projects: The following projects are using Farm Bill 2014 NEPA Authorities and are anticipated to be implemented next FY. Most if not all will use the legislated 3,000 acre (maximum) CE:*
 - *Boulder Lowlands (B-D), Westside, Showdown Hwy 89 (Lewis-Clark); Helwick (KTN), Upper Sheep Creek: Total Acres: 2,580; anticipated Volume: 14 MMBF*
- *FY 16 Regular Program - Additionally, because of the location of the designated I & D areas and the Forest out-year program, we would anticipate additional acres and volume similar or slight increase as represented by the FY 15 program above, using regular NEPA authorities.*

As most, if not all of the committee members understand, the Forest Service faces a challenging environment with regard to litigation of our projects. Just as with the recent state timber projects which have been affected by the HCP litigation, litigation similarly impacts our ability to quickly implement projects since it takes time to work through the courts. However, the Forest Service has received favorable rulings on 17 of the last 19 challenges to Forest Service projects in Region One, and this past year (FY14) the Forest Service Region One met our nationally assigned timber target of 570,000 CCF of timber volume sold. This recent success is due in part to

the partnership which we are forging with the State of Montana under the Master Stewardship Agreement and certainly would not be possible without our partners in the wood products industry here in Montana.

Good morning Sonja – This is in addition to the timber information that I shared with you yesterday, at the request of Chairman Vincent.

Here's some deferred maintenance info and other stats that might be of interest to your committee for US Forest Service Region One (which includes all of MT, northern ID, and western ND). It's not all-inclusive, but it may help inform the discussion. Due to short turnaround time on this, in some cases the numbers available were Region-wide vs. specific to Montana. However, given that of the 25 million acres of national forest system lands in Region One, 17 million are in Montana, it is reasonable to figure that the majority of any Region-wide figures that are cited can be attributable to National Forests in Montana.

I am also attaching several documents: land transactions in Montana which involved the US Forest Service as well as roads information broken out by Forest and county which was made available to the interim SJ15 Study of Federal Lands or individually to Senator Fielder or other legislators per their request and is publicly available information. The last attachment pertains to recent history of road decommissioning on the National Forests in Montana and was provided by Julia Altemus, I deleted the non-MT Forests in R1 to focus it more on our operations within the State of Montana.

- **Region One Budget:** FY2012 \$238 million, FY2013 \$242 million. (Rough estimate of MT Forests and share of RO for 2012=\$180 million)
- **Trails:** Region One has 28,151 miles of trails.
 - Motorized trails: 12,405 miles
 - Total nonmotorized trails: 15,746 miles
 - Non-motorized trails within Congressionally-designated Wilderness: 5,466
 - 4000 miles of snowmobile trails on national forest system lands in Montana
 - National trails budget covers 15-18% of the operations & maintenance, Cap I, DM needs for the trail system in Montana

- National Forests in MT share of deferred maintenance trails costs (i.e. maintenance backlog)=\$25,806,709
- **Developed sites:** Region One has 1,658 developed recreation sites (CGs, picnic areas, interp sites, boat landings, parking lots, etc)
 - Annual O&M costs to manage all developed recreation sites to standard is over \$10 million / year
 - National Forests in MT share of deferred maintenance costs for developed sites (i.e. maintenance backlog)=\$19,037,073
 - Administrative facilities (ranger stations, bunkhouses, fire caches, lookouts, guard stations, etc) total deferred mtce backlog costs for Montana National Forests: \$84,895,451
- **Fences:** Approximately 3980 miles of fencing is located on National Forests in Montana (2009 info). Condition/deferred maintenance needs info was not immediately available.
- **Roads:** Montana NFs have 31,383 miles of system roads (see attachment). 9631 closed (basic custodial care), 13,450 high clearance roads, 8302 are passable by passenger car. Road budget for Montana NFs in FY2013 was \$6.875 million. Most recent roads deferred maintenance survey (i.e. backlog) estimated costs to bring all roads and bridges up to standard would be approximately \$50 million.
- **Fire:** The Forest Service has estimated costs for the Montana portion of Region 1 for fire preparedness at \$70 million per year and fire suppression costs at \$30 to 120 million per year. The preparedness costs are based on an estimated MT fair share of the Region's and some of the National programs (such as some aviation contracts that are handled nationally). The suppression costs are an estimated range of costs that could occur. We do not have the systems or the methodology to accurately calculate suppression costs in the manner requested, so these are merely estimates using information that was available.
- **Invasives:** Noxious weeds have been mapped on 534,000 acres of NFS lands in MT, and the Forests annually treat approximately 5% of mapped acres per year, or 44,767 acres in 2013 at a cost of approximately \$2 million of appropriated funds annually.
- **Grazing:** Approximately 369,000 head-months (487,000 animal unit-months) grazed NFS lands in Montana in 2013
- **Litigation of forest management projects:** Volume currently in some phase of litigation: 164 MMBF. Approximately 33 MMBF of the 164 MMBF is not suspended or enjoined; operations can proceed weather permitting. Notices of Intent to Sue: 4 projects have NOIs that cover 70 MMBF, above and beyond the 164 MMBF
