A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING THE DEFINITION OF PERMISSIBLE FIREWORKS; PROVIDING REFERENCES TO CURRENT FEDERAL REGULATIONS RELATED TO CONSUMER FIREWORKS; REMOVING EXCLUSIONS OF CERTAIN FIREWORKS; AMENDING SECTION 50-37-105; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 50-37-105, MCA, is amended to read:

"50-37-105. Permissible fireworks. Permissible fireworks, ~~excluding sky rockets, roman candles, and bottle rockets,~~ include and are limited to those that meet the definition of ~~"common fireworks"~~ "consumer fireworks" as ~~set forth in the U.S. department of transportation's Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR, parts 173.88 and 173.100, as they read on January 1, 1985, provided in 27 CFR 555.11~~ and that comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the U.S. consumer product safety commission, as set forth in 16 CFR, ~~part 1507, as it read on January 1, 1985~~ parts 1500 and 1507."

NEW SECTION. **Section 2. Effective date.** [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
