16	"2-18	3-103. Officers and employees excepted. Parts 1 through 3 and 10 do not apply to the following		
17	officers and employees in state government:			
18	(1)	elected officials;		
19	(2)	county assessors and their chief deputies;		
20	(3)	employees of the office of consumer counsel;		
21	(4)	judges and employees of the judicial branch;		
22	(5)	members of boards and commissions appointed by the governor, the legislature, or other elected		
23	state officials;			
24	(6)	officers or members of the militia;		
25	(7)	agency heads appointed by the governor;		
26	(8)	academic and professional administrative personnel with individual contracts under the authority		
27	of the board of regents of higher education;			
28	(9)	academic and professional administrative personnel and live-in houseparents who have entered		

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1	into individual contracts with the state school for the deaf and blind under the authority of the state board of				
2	public education;				
3	(10) investment officer, assistant investment officer, executive director, and eight professional staff				
4	positions of the board of investments;				
5	(11) four professional staff positions under the board of oil and gas conservation;

18	Section 2. Section 23-7-210, MCA, is amended to read:				
19	"23-7-210. Director appointment compensation qualifications. (1) The director must be				
20	appointed by the governor and shall hold office at the pleasure of the governor.				
21	(2) The director must be qualified by training and experience to direct the state lottery, including				
22	sports wagering. The director must be a full-time employee and may not engage in any other occupation.				
23	(3) The director's salary is equal to 90% of the salary of the director of the department of				
24	administration."

26	Section 3. Section 23-7-212, MCA, is amended to read:				
27	"23-7-212. Assistant director for security qualifications duties compensation. (1) The				
28	director shall appoint an assistant director for security, who serves at the pleasure of the director.				



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1	(2) The assistant director for security must be qualified by training and experience, have at leas	t 5
2	vears of law enforcement experience, and be knowledgeable and experienced in computer security.	
3	(3) The assistant director for security:	
4	(a) must be responsible for a security division to ensure security, honesty, fairness, and integrity	/ in
5	he operation and administration of the state lottery, including but not limited to an examination of the	
6	packground of all prospective employees, sales agents, lottery and sports wagering vendors, and contract	tors.
7	The security division is designated a law enforcement agency for the purpose of administering this chapte	r.
8	(b) shall, in conjunction with the director, confer with the attorney general or the attorney general	l's
9	designee to promote and ensure security, honesty, fairness, and integrity of the operation and administra	ion of
10	he state lottery and establish a memorandum of understanding that contemplates investigatory and regul	atory
11	collaboration and assistance between the department of justice and the state lottery as considered neces	sary
12	by both parties; and	
13	(c) shall, in conjunction with the director, report any alleged violation of law to the attorney gene	ral,
14	he legislative auditor, and any other appropriate law enforcement authority for further investigation and a	ction.
15	(4) The salary of the assistant director for security is equal to 90% of the salary of the director of	the
16	ottery."
