12	special revenue fund an account ACCOUNTS for fees collected for 9-1-1 services pursuant to 10-4-201.		
13	(2) Except as provided in subsection (5), funds in the account ACCOUNTS are statutorily		
14	appropriated to the department, as provided in 17-7-502. Except as provided in subsection (3), funds that are		
15	not used for the administration of this chapter by the department, used for public safety radio communications,		
16	if allowable, used for public safety radio communications, if allowable, or transferred in accordance with		
17	subsection-subsections (5) and (6) are allocated as follows:		
18	(a) 75% of the account must be deposited in an account for distribution to local and tribal		
19	government entities that host public safety answering points in accordance with 10-4-305 and with rules		
20	adopted by the department in accordance with 10-4-108; and		
21	(b) $\frac{25\%}{7\%}$ of the account must be deposited in an account for distribution in the form of grants to		
22	private telecommunications providers, local or tribal government entities that host public safety answering		
23	points, or both in accordance with 10-4-306-; and		
24	(c) 18% of the account must be deposited in an account for use by the department, WHICH SHALL		
25	CONFER WITH THE 9-1-1 ADVISORY COUNCIL ON PROPOSED EXPENDITURES AND IMPLEMENTATION for a statewide next		
26	generation 9-1-1 system.		
27	(3) All money received by the department of revenue pursuant to 10-4-201 must be paid to the		
28	state treasurer for deposit in the appropriate account.

- (a) 75% of the account must be deposited in an account for distribution to local and tribal government entities that host public safety answering points in accordance with 10-4-305 and with rules adopted by the department in accordance with 10-4-108; and
