7	SUBJECT TO GREATER PENALTIES; AND AMENDING SECTION 61-8-316, MCA."

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11	Section 1. Section 61-8-316, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"61-8-316. Fleeing from or eluding peace officer. (1) A person operating a motor vehicle commits
13	the offense of fleeing from or eluding a peace officer if a uniformed peace officer operating a police vehicle in
14	the lawful performance of the peace officer's duty gives the person a visual or audible signal by hand, voice,
15	emergency light, or siren directing the person to stop the motor vehicle and the person knowingly fails to obey
16	the signal by increasing the speed of the motor vehicle, continuing at a speed that is 10 or more miles an hour
17	above the applicable speed limit, extinguishing the motor vehicle's lights, or otherwise fleeing from, eluding, or
18	attempting to flee from or elude the peace officer.
19	(2) (a) Except as provided in subsection (2)(b), a person convicted of or pleading guilty or nolo
20	contendere to an offense under subsection (1) shall be imprisoned for a term not to exceed 1 year or fined an
21	amount not to exceed \$2,000, or both.
22	(b) A person convicted of an offense of fleeing from or eluding a peace officer during which the
23	person causes serious bodily injury to or the death of any other person or during which the person exceeds the
24	applicable speed limit by more than 20 miles an hour shall be imprisoned for a term not to exceed 10 years or
25	fined an amount not to exceed \$10,000, or both."
