8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10	Section 1. Section 76-6-202, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"76-6-202. Duration of conservation easements. Conservation (1) Except as provided in subsection
12	(2), conservation easements may be granted either in perpetuity or for a term of years. If granted for a term of
13	years, that term may not be less than 15 years. An easement granted for a term of years may be renewed for a
14	term of 15 or more years upon on the execution of a new granting instrument by the parties.
15	(2) (a) If the establishment of a conservation easement includes state funds, the term of the
16	easement may not exceed 40 years. The limits of this subsection (2)(a) do not apply to conservation easements
17	that:
18	(i) are less than 1,500 acres;
19	(ii) are acquired using forest legacy program funds granted by the United States forest service;
20	(iii) include area described as core habitat as defined by the United States fish and wildlife service;
21	<u>or</u>
22	(iv) are granted pursuant to Title 87, chapter 5, part 9.
23	(b) Easements subject to term limits under subsection (2)(a) may be renewed for a term of up to
24	40 years on the execution of a new granting instrument by the parties.
25	(c) For the purposes of subsection (2)(a), the term "state funds" includes federal funds transferred
26	to the state."

28	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
