  - b. Long way: [www.leg.mt.gov](http://www.leg.mt.gov) and select Interim/Interim Committees/Past Interim Committee/Districting and Apportionment Commission 2011-2012
  - c. Foolproof way: Call Rachel Weiss or Joe Kolman for assistance
3. **What's available online**
  - a. Google Maps
  - b. Google Earth
  - c. PDFs of Senate and House Districts (these print!)
  - d. Tables
  - e. Reports. Lots of reports

  - a. Advantages: the detail is tremendous
  - b. Disadvantages: requires a program download
