I have no history of any kind of substance abuse. He also stated I needed mental health evaluation after I already was cleared by Mental Health.

In my hearing Mike McMee would not allow me to speak on my behalf. In May of 2012 128 days before I saw the board I received 1 write up and 1 only 1 for refusing a direct order because I refused to live in a housing unit. I now have 8 months clear conduct.

I was also denied the chance of any community placement. I've been to community placement 1 time and was revoked for having a cell phone and speaking to an unauthorized male.

I am not a violent offender or sexual offender. I should be allowed the chance of at least community placement. They stated I could not have any early consideration and if I got a single write up I'd wait until 2015 to see the board which would make me serve almost 4 years of my 5 year sentence. This is totally unfair. I appreciate your help. Thank you.

Dear Ms. Osler:

I am requesting a reconsideration hearing pursuant to ARM 20.25.501 (7)(a) of the reappearance hearing held on April 23, 2012, based on false or erroneous information, or hearing not conducted according to board procedure that prejudiced the disposition as follows:

1. Mr. McKee asked the County Attorney representative, Mr. VanValkenburg, if I could have been given the death penalty. Mr. VanValkenburg said, "yes, I believe so." ***This information is false as I could not have received the death penalty, nor was it ever on the table for discussion. This statement strongly shows a tainted and biased decision creating prejudice. Pursuant to Due Process Clause of 442 US, at 11, 60 Led 2d 668 an inmate is entitled to have his release date considered by a parole board that is free from bias or prejudice.***
2. Mr. McKee stated that he felt a reappearance in 5 years was justified because of the notoriety of my case due to the fact that I am a woman from a small town as "he is from a small town on the western side of the state and he knows how these things affect the small town communities" and the hardship of traveling on the victim's family. ***This statement shows a tainted and biased decision creating prejudice. Pursuant to Due Process Clause of 442 US, at 11, 60 Led 2d 668 an inmate is entitled to have his release date considered by a parole board that is free from bias or prejudice.***
3. Ms. O'Conner asked me if anything had changed since they last saw me on April 24, 2007. She then asked me if I was now ready to admit my guilt. I told her "yes, I'm guilty. A jury of my peers found me guilty and I have accepted responsibility and have done my time." She then said, "that's not what I asked you, did you shoot your husband?" I responded, "no, I did not." She then shook her head and sighed. ***My release should not be jeopardized by continuing to maintain my innocence, as a conviction of offense does not deprive the offender of a civil or constitutional right. (2002 MT 333: State v. Shreves)***
4. Ms. O'Conner stated that "we believe you are guilty after reviewing the physical evidence." ***There was never any physical evidence connecting me to the homicide. I was convicted on circumstantial evidence. This also should be a presumption of judicial decision, not Board decision based on speculation and opinion.***
5. Ms. O'Conner allowed me to respond after listening to all the testimonies presented which lasted approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes, but asked me to "limit my response to about a paragraph." ***This shows a bias that created prejudice.***

6. Pursuant to ARM 20.25.401 (2), Board shall make a record of all hearings. *Not having a transcript of the hearing goes against the Board's rules of procedure.*
7. The hearing reappearance standards are not the same as when I was sentenced in 1993. Annual review was the standard. *This is an Ex Post Facto case which the decrease in frequency of parole suitability hearing constricts the opportunity to earn early release thus constituting increased punishment. (16 F. 3d 1001 Morales v. California Dept. of Corrections)*
8. The Boards decision to deny was based upon 1) Nature and severity of offense, 2) Multiple offenses, 3) Strong objection from criminal justice authorities and or citizenry. *1) The "nature and severity" of offense is an immutable factor that can never change. 2) I am serving prison time only for the deliberate homicide charge. Considering my consecutive suspended sentence in the denial of parole is enhancing my sentence. 3) Victim and community opposition also is beyond defendant's control. The victims made accusations that defendant has never tried to contact them or apologize; however, any dialogue between victim(s) and defendant must be initiated and driven by the victim's family.(DOC 1-8-2(b)) The criminal justice authorities did not oppose my participation in a work release program in January of 2012.*

The "nature of offense" cannot overcome state language as in MCA 46-23-201. This statute is mandatory and limits the Board's discretion when confronted with uncontroverted evidence that a defendant would not be a detriment to society if released. Board is invading the province of the judiciary by using boiler plate criteria to deny parole such as "nature of offense" as a reason to deny and delay granting parole, because the District Court already has pronounced a sentence based upon nature and severity of crime. (2009 Mont. LEXIS 153: Wing v. Mt. Board of Pardons and Parole)

9. The Board allowed testimony outside the scope of what is allowed pursuant to ARM 20.25.401 (5)(a,b,c). *This shows a bias that created prejudice.*
10. The Board failed to explain how a longer period of incarceration will make me any more ready for release to community. *This essentially creates a sentence enhancement of Life without Parole, when I clearly was sentenced with an expectation of parole. (96 LED 2D 303, 482 US369, 792 F 2d 1404 Board of Pardons v. Allen)*
11. Pursuant to ARM 20.25.505 Criteria for Release Grant Decisions on Nonmedical Parole.
 - (1) A board hearing panel may release an eligible offender on nonmedical parole only when, in its opinion:
 - a. There is reasonable probability that the offender can be released without detriment to himself/herself or to the community; *I was out without bond for approximately 1 year and lived a life of a law abiding citizen while on trial before the verdict and my incarceration. There is no evidence to the contrary, and all prison records and mental health evaluations support my success.*
 - b. Release is in the best interests of society; *it costs approximately \$79 per day to keep me in prison versus approximately \$4 per day on parole.*
 - c. The offender is able and willing to fulfill the obligations of a law-abiding citizen; and *This is supported by all prison records, and there is no evidence to the contrary. I had a job offer starting at \$19.00 per hour full time.*

- d. The offender does not require continued correctional treatment, or mental health therapy, vocational or other programs available in the correctional facility that will substantially enhance the offender's capacity to lead a law-abiding life if released. ***This is supported by all prison records and well as the recognition given by the Board itself.***
- (2) In making its determination regarding release, the board hearing panel may consider each of the following factors:
- a. The offender's maturity, stability, sense of responsibility and development of traits and behaviors which increase the likelihood the offender will conform his/her behaviors to the requirements of law; **Supported by staff evaluations and letters of recommendation.**
 - b. The adequacy of the offender's release plan; **This was not contested.**
 - c. The offender's ability and readiness to assume obligations and undertake responsibilities; **Supported by staff evaluations, letters of recommendation, and job offer.**
 - d. The offender's education and training; **I was commended by the Board for all the education and training I have done.**
 - e. The offender's family status and whether the offender has relatives who display an interest or whether the offender has other close and constructive associations in the community; **Supported by witnesses at hearing and letters of support.**
 - f. The offender's employment history, occupational skills, and the stability of the offender's past employment; **Supported by all prison evaluations and letters of recommendation.**
 - g. The type of residence, neighborhood or community in which the offender plans to live; **This was not contested and I had a letter of support for my living plan.**
 - h. The offender's past use of chemicals (including alcohol), and past habitual and/or abusive use of such chemicals; **Not applicable.**
 - i. The offender's mental and/or physical makeup; **Positive evaluation from mental health staff.**
 - j. The offender's prior criminal record, including the nature and circumstances of the offense, date of offense and frequency of previous offenses; **Not applicable.**
 - k. The offender's attitude toward law and authority; **Positively noted in prison evaluations and letters of recommendation by prison staff.**
 - l. The offender's conduct in the institution, including particularly whether the offender has taken advantage of opportunities for treatment, and whether the offender is clear of major disciplinary violations prior to the hearing; **I have 19+ years of clear conduct and program complete.**
 - m. The offender's behavior and attitude during any previous experience of supervision and the recency of such experience; **Not applicable.**
 - n. Any statement of the victim or victims of the offense; **Statements were made by the victims outside of the scope of what should have been allowed according to the Rules of Procedure.**
 - o. Whether parole at this time would diminish the seriousness of the offense; **I have already done 5 years beyond the expected parole date as sentenced by the court, so I don't know how this could possibly diminish the seriousness of the offense.**

Your letter dated June 4, 2012, was received at the Board's office. Please be advised that

The Montana Board of Pardons and Parole may release any person confined in a State prison when the Board believes the person is able and willing to fulfill the obligations of a law-abiding citizen and when the Board believes the prisoner can be released without detriment to the prisoner or to the community. Parole may be ordered only for the best interests of society and not as an award of clemency or a reduction of sentence or pardon (46-23-201, MCA).

In April 2012, you personally appeared before the Board, testified on your own behalf and were given the opportunity to submit any information demonstrating that you are a reasonable parole candidate. The Board heard testimony from your family, friends and correction officials supporting your release. The Board acknowledged and applauded the rehabilitative steps that you have taken during your incarceration. You were commended for your accomplishments and contributions in prison.

The Board also heard extensive and heartfelt testimony from the victim's family members coupled with opposition from the Missoula County Attorney. The victim's family voiced strong opposition to granting your early release on parole. The victim's family testified to the devastating impact that Mr. Richards' murder has continued to have on them. They expressed their extreme distress and apprehension caused by the consideration of your early release from prison. When victims and family members of victims testify, the Board carefully considers their opinion as to whether the prisoner is a reasonable candidate for parole.

Testimony of this nature carries great weight with the citizen members of the Board and pursuant to A.R.M.20.25-401(4) & (5), 20.25-505 and Mont. Code Ann. § 46-23-201, the Board is required to consider such evidence in making its decision regarding an application for parole. After careful evaluation of all relevant facts and information, the Board denied your parole application and scheduled you for a reappearance hearing in April 2017. The Board strongly believed that there is reasonable probability that your early release on parole would not be in the best interests of the community because an early release would diminish the severity of your offense, and, therefore, be a detriment to the community. In the opinion of the Board, positive behavior is expected of all offenders and does not convince the Board that you meet all the statutory requirements for early release on parole nor is it, alone, a reliable predictor of future behavior. The Courts have consistently ruled that Montana parole statutes give the Board great discretion in determining whether and when an inmate should be granted early release. Additionally, they have concluded that the Board's broad discretionary authority (emphasizing that parole is a privilege and not a right), is granted as a matter of grace. Finally, the Courts without fail have rejected claims that the changes in administrative rules allowing for extended reviews increases the term of confinement for prisoners and determined that the Ex Post Facto Clause does not apply to administrative rules.

In your reference to "transcript of the hearing" according to ARM 20.25.401 (2); ***The presiding board member shall conduct hearings informally and shall have discretion to allow or not allow any proposed testimony.*** [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The "record of the hearing" is the written disposition signed by the Board and the minutes of the hearing. It does not state the Board staff will make an "audio /video recording" of hearings".

The Board of Pardons and Parole is confident the Board's official discretion was reasonably exercised in your case. If you feel that legal action is in your best interest, by all means seek legal remedies.





To the Members of the Law and Justice Interim Committee
Madam Chair and Fellow Members,

My name is Terri Braun Wetzel. For the record my AO # is 41533 and I am currently on TL status at the Passages Prerelease center. I am very grateful to be able to present testimony in the hopes that my experience will assist you in implementing reform of the Montana Board of Pardons and Parole. I have written numerous articles about the problems concerning the Board: both it's members and it's employees.

In March of 2011 I was found guilty of several probation violations. I was serving time from a 2003 conviction of ISS Bad Checks that had been revoked. The sentence was a Department of Corrections commitment. I was revoked and sent directly to the Montana Women's Prison with no opportunity for sanction or other community placement. Upon arrival at the Prison I was already Parole eligible so I refused to waive my right to see the Board and appeared in June of 2011. I requested to go to Bootcamp. My file contains a note from Fern Osler that states "Ms. Wetzel has the audacity to ask to go to Bootcamp knowing that she has only been at the Prison for 2 months and that there is no Bootcamp available for the women." Neither of these comments would have been an issue if I had been a man. The Board at that time flopped me for 2 years with no chance of community placement. The reasons that they verbally used were not the reasons they checked on their paper.

In September of 2012 I requested the opportunity to go to the Culinary Arts Program at Passages (CAP). This is an 18-month program.

In February 2014 I saw the Board. Just short of 3 years since my previous appearance. I was granted parole upon completion of Pre Release. I asked the members and Mike Webster if they would waive the TL portion and allow me to go out on Parole. Mr. Webster said he would talk to Passages about this and to my knowledge this has never occurred since I am currently on TL. Mr. Webster marked all of the "standard" conditions on the form. I asked him to remove the requirement for CD Counseling, not being able to maintain a checking account, mental health counseling as well as several other standards. He told me to take it up with my PO when they are assigned even though failure to comply would be a violation. Please see the attached forms. I am not now nor have I ever been chemically dependent. I have been assessed numerous times. My judgment makes no stipulation as to my not being allowed to drink or any requirement for treatment or costly counseling. My Judgment does not prohibit me from having a checking account. As far as the requirement for mental health counseling: since March of 2011 the Department of Corrections has not provided counseling and I have not taken medication for any mental health issues with the exception of a short time period from November 2013-January 2014. They did not want to pay for any treatment or counseling but want to require me to. On a side note I have no problem seeking help or Counseling my issue is that the Board with no factual basis now mandates this.



Now that she is in the pre-release phase of her program and employed, she will begin making laarger payments of at least 5 % of her net income per month towards this.


