County Project Detail
FY 2017 Awards

Beaverhead County- Mental Health Professional and Discharge Coordinator in Detention Center, crisis intervention training and policy development for implementing mental health services in the jail.

Cascade County- Create, implement, and manage a Crisis Response Team in the County.

Dawson County- Re-open Inpatient Behavioral Health Unit in Dawson County and Consultant to assist in completion of multi-county strategic plan for crisis intervention and jail diversion.

Fergus County- Provide short-term mental health treatment for non-violent offenders at Central Montana Medical Center and crisis intervention training for Law Enforcement.

Gallatin County –Crisis Intervention Team, Mental Health First Aid training, suicide prevention and postpartum depression training. Community mentorship across the state. Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (0.15 FTE) in Detention Center and 2.0 FTE Peer Support Specialists for mental health outreach with law enforcement.

Hill County- Mental Health First Aid and behavioral health training for detention center staff. Behavioral Health Services in the detention center which includes onsite emergent evaluations and substance use assessments. Partner with The Salvation Army Reintegration to Society Program to reduce habitual detention and involuntary commitment.

Lake County- 1 FTE Mental Health Professional at Lake House Crisis Facility.

Lewis and Clark County – 1 FTE Mental Health Professional and 1 FTE Discharge Coordinator at the Detention Center and provide remaining funds to fully operate the 24/7 Crisis Response Team.

Missoula County – Construct 2 secure beds at Dakota Place, 1 FTE Mental Health Professional in Detention Center, 0.35 FTE Crisis Response Team, and Crisis Intervention Team Training.

Park County- Crisis Intervention Team training, 0.01 FTE Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP), 0.05 FTE Mental Health Professional and 0.5 RN specialist in Detention Center.

Ravalli County – 1 FTE Mental Health Professional on the Crisis Response Team.

Richland County –Mental Health First Aid training, 1.5 FTE Registered Nurse in Detention Center for early recognition of mental health service needs and crisis prevention, evaluation and initial therapy session for identified vulnerable population upon release from Detention Center.

Valley County- Provide crisis intervention services at Frances Mahon Deaconess Hospital, utilize Mental Health Professional from Eastern Montana Community Mental Health Center for assessment and treatment.

Yellowstone County – Community Crisis Center will continue to provide 24/7 access to crisis intervention services, including 1 FTE Discharge Coordinator and at least once yearly Crisis Intervention Team training.
