

Other Information

Other notes

- Because the travel factors for the 1st and 14th Judicial Districts are not altered from the 2015 data, it is possible that the 1st District judges would travel less and the 14th District judge would travel more as a result of the proposed change. Either way, changes in travel due to reallocation of counties could not be calculated, but will affect the reliability of the judicial need calculation.
- The two counties with the largest caseloads would be on opposite sides of the 14th Judicial District, which might affect the judge's travel factor.
- The 1st Judicial District operates a drug treatment court; the 14th Judicial District does not.
