**Decision Notice

**Description of the Proposed Action:**

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks proposes a maintenance project at Woods Bay Fishing Access Site.

The proposed action is to complete the following:

1. Widen and gravel about 200 linear yards of existing roads and add curbing to about 75 feet of roadway along the lakeshore.
2. Replace existing boat ramp with a sixteen-foot-wide concrete ramp.
3. Install about 100 feet of riprap.
4. Repair an existing breakwater.
5. Install a gate at the entrance to the site.
6. If funding allows, install a floating dock.

**Public Comment:**

One letter with comments and one verbal comment were received. The concerns in the letter were as follows:

**1. The EA does not fully address the noise during construction.**

FWP recognizes that there will be increases in traffic and noise during the construction period. While these may be annoying, the impacts will be temporary in nature. Construction will be done during business hours to reduce impacts on neighbors, but there is no means to eliminate those impacts.

**2. The EA does not evaluate the effect of construction traffic on the county roads leading up to the site.**

The vehicles used by the contractor should not be heavy enough to impact roads built to county standards. It will be the responsibility of the contractor to ensure damage does not occur due to impacts from his equipment.

**3. Concerns that the additions to the groin will increase beach erosion on adjoining properties.**

The expertise of a hydrologist will be used to ensure that rebuilding the groin does not increase erosion on adjacent property.

**4. Trespass, including excessive party noise and motor recreational vehicles, on FWP property such as trails and steep hillsides. The letter recommended that the site be closed after dark and law enforcement be required to patrol the area.**

While enforcement issues are outside the scope of this assessment, the neighbor's concerns are recognized as valid. A gate has been added to this project, which will enable the site to be closed at night. A volunteer will have to be found who is willing to do this. Signing at the site will also be checked to ensure that it states the site is for day use only, and enforcement will be notified about the late night issues.

**5. A high potential for fire in the undeveloped area of the FWP property.**

Forestry issues are outside the scope of this environmental assessment. However, a forest assessment and programmatic environmental assessment was done for all state parks and fishing access sites in 2003. At Woods Bay the recommendation was that a pre-commercial thin of about ten acres of saplings on the west half be done within five years. FWP has begun implementation of the forestry recommendations. Woods Bay will be done in order of priority.

**Verbal comment:**

The verbal comment received was regarding concerns about trespass, late night parties, and noise. Due to these concerns a gate has been added to this project, which will enable the site to be closed at night. A volunteer will have to be found who is willing to do this. Signing at the site will also be checked to ensure that it states that site is for day use only, and enforcement will be notified about the late night issues.


**Finding of No Significant Impact:**

Based on the analysis in the Environmental Assessment (EA), I find Alternative B, to widen and gravel roads, replace concrete ramp, install riprap along shoreline, rebuild breakwater, install a gate, and install a dock, if financially feasible, to be the preferred alternative. I have evaluated the EA and applicable laws, regulations, and policies and have determined that this action will not have a significant effect on the human environment. Therefore, an environmental impact statement will not be prepared.

In accordance with FWP policy, an appeal may be made by any person who has either commented in writing to the department on the proposed project, or who has registered or commented orally at a public meeting held by the department on the proposed project, or who can provide new evidence that would otherwise change the proposed plan. An appeal must be submitted to the Director of FWP in writing and must be postmarked or received within 30 days of this decision notice. The appeal must describe the basis for the appeal, how the appellant has previously commented to the department or participated in the decision making process, and how the department can provide relief.
