Name of drainage where the pond would be located: Yellowstone

Name(s) of fish species proposed for introduction: Yellowstone Cutthroat Trout

Is this species of fish legally present in the drainage? Species is not native to the drainage, but has been legally introduced.

List species of special concern present in the drainage: Yellowstone cutthroat trout

RISKS:

Inlets to or outlets from the pond? No. Inlets to the pond are screened and the outlet is overflow into an isolated depression in the topography.

Potential for impacts on genetic structure of existing fish populations?

Comments: If the fish were moved from the pond to the Yellowstone River they would have potential to interbreed with wild fish.

Impacts to any life stage of existing fish population due to competition and/or predation? None ___ Minor X Major ___

Comments: If the fish were moved from the pond to the Yellowstone River they would have potential to compete with wild fish.

Impacts to other forms of aquatic life that may be caused by this introduction?

Comments: Impacts would be limited to aquatic life present in the pond.

Potential for the proposed new species to reproduce in this location?

Comments: Small inlet and outlet streams are present, but would at best provide very little or no spawning.

If necessary, would it be feasible to remove this species after it has been stocked?

Yes. The pond could be drained and nets or chemical removal could take place. Draining and allowing winterkill may be an option as well.

Would this introduction result in impacts that are individually limited, but cumulatively considerable?

Yes. Private ponds constitute a cumulative impact to wild fisheries and aquatic systems.

Describe reasonable and prudent alternatives to this action, if any (including no action).

No action. The landowner would not be granted a permit to stock the pond.

Describe and evaluate mitigation, stipulations, or other control measures enforceable by the agency, if any.

Pond must be screened and screens must be functional at all times. Only Yellowstone cutthroat trout from an approved source are to be stocked.
