**PUBLIC NOTICE NO. MT-10-39

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

The purpose of this notice is to state the Department's intention to issue wastewater discharge permits to the facilities listed in this notice. These permits are issued by the Department under the authority of 75-5-402, Montana Code Annotated (MCA) and the Administrative Rules of Montana 17.30.1001 *et seq.*, Montana Ground Water Pollution Control System (MGWPCS). The Water Protection Bureau has prepared draft permits for the facilities listed below. The permit authorizes the discharge of treated residential-strength wastewater from 25 single-family mobile home lots. Raw sewage and wastewater is collected in a community septic tank where settleable and floatable solids are removed. The wastewater will receive Level 2 treatment. Effluent enters a dose tank-pump tank, which discharges to a subsurface drainfield (Outfall 001) prior to entering the ground water. The daily design flow is 8,750 gallons per day (gpd).

Ground water beneath the property is listed as Class I according to the Administrative Rules of Montana [ARM 17.30.1006(1)]. The permittee is required to monitor the effluent quarterly to insure the effective removal of total suspended solids (TSS), biological oxygen

demand (BOD), total Kjeldahl nitrogen, and nitrate + nitrite (as N). A source-specific 300-foot ground water mixing zone has been granted for the subsurface drainfield. The Department has determined that the discharge will not cause significant degradation of the ground water beyond the mixing zone boundaries.

This is a renewal of an existing permit for the Manley Meadows Subdivision wastewater treatment system (WWTS). The subdivision consists of 42 single-family residences. The WWTS is currently used to treat residential strength (domestic) wastewater. The WWTS has a design capacity of 14,700 gallons per day with treatment consisting of individual septic tanks and a pressure-dosed elevated sand mound.

The proposed permit renewal authorizes the permittee to discharge treated domestic wastewater to ground water from a drainfield identified as outfall 001. Outfall 001 is located in the northeast corner of the Manley Meadows Subdivision; northeast quarter of Section 25, Township 01 South, Range 05 East or 45° 43' 34" North Latitude and 111° 02' 38" West Longitude in Gallatin County, Montana.

During the public comment period provided by the notice, the Department will accept requests for a

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public hearing. A request for a public hearing must be in writing and must state the nature of the issue proposed to be raised in the hearing (ARM 17.30.1024).

The Department will respond to all substantive comments and issue a final decision within sixty days of this notice or as soon as possible thereafter. The complete administrative record, including permit application and other pertinent information, is maintained at the Water Protection Bureau office in Helena and is available for review during business hours.

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
