Long drilling time: No, 30 to 40 days drilling time.

Unusually deep drilling (high horsepower rig): No, triple derrick rig 1000 HP to drill a single lateral Bakken Formation horizontal well test, 19,870' MD/10,494' TVD.

Possible H2S gas production: Slight

In/near Class I air quality area: No Class I air quality area.

Air quality permit for flaring/venting (if productive): Yes, DEQ air quality permit required under rule 75-2-211.

Comments: Gas pipeline system in the area to take associated gas.

Water Quality

(possible concerns)

Salt/oil based mud: Yes to intermediate casing string hole to be drilled with oil based invert drilling fluids. Horizontal laterals will be drilled with oil based invert drilling fluid. Surface casing hole to be drilled with freshwater and freshwater mud.

High water table: No high water table anticipated.

Surface drainage leads to live water: Yes, closest drainage is an unnamed ephemeral tributary drainage to Red Bank Creek, about 3/8 of a mile south and 1/4 of a mile to the northwest from this location. Within this drainage are stock ponds.

Water well contamination: No, closest water wells are about 1 mile or further away in any direction from this location. Surface casing will be drilled with freshwater, casing set to 2056' and cemented back to surface.

Porous/permeable soils: No, sandy silty clay soils.

Class I stream drainage No, Class I stream drainages.

Comments: 2056' surface casing well below freshwater zones in adjacent water wells. Also, covering Base of the Fox Hills aquifer. Surface hole will be drilled with freshwater and freshwater muds to 2056'+. Steel surface casing will be run and cemented to surface from 2056'.

Soils/Vegetation/Land Use

(possible concerns)

Steam crossings: None anticipated.

High erosion potential: Possible, location will require a moderate cut, up to 15.6' and moderate fill, up to 14.1', required.

Loss of soil productivity: Slight, location to be restored after drilling well if well is nonproductive. If productive unused portion of wellsite will be reclaimed.

Unusually large wellsite: No, location is a large wellsite, 330'X450' in size.

Damage to improvements: Slight, surface use appears to be grassland.

Conflict with existing land use/values: Slight

Comments: Access will be over existing county gravel roads and existing farm road. About 1397' of new access road will be built off the existing county road into this location. Oil based drilling fluids will be recycled. Freshwater surface hole cuttings will be buried on site. Oil based drill cuttings will be buried in the lined reserve pit. Completion pit fluids will be hauled to a permitted Class II saltwater disposal. Pit will be backfilled when dry. No concerns.

Health Hazards/Noise

Proximity to public facilities/residences: Residences about 3/4 of a mile to the east from this location.

Possibility of H2S: Slight to none.

Size of rig/length of drilling time: Triple drilling rig 30 to 40 days drilling time.

Comments: Adequate surface casing cemented to surface with working BOP stack should mitigate any problems. Noise should not be a problems, sufficient distance from residence to rig should mitigate this.
