Appropriation Status: Appropriation and expenditure information provided for FY 2010as of April 30, 2010, Appropriations for FY 2011 also provided.

Comments/Issues: School district accreditation status improved for the second year in a row. In this period, those in advice status declined from 7.0% in FY 2009 to 4.98% in FY 2010 and those in deficiency status declining from 12.9% in FY 2009 to 9.36% in FY 2010. Additional improvements will need to occur for the number of school districts in deficiency status to achieve the target of 5 percent, With 14,186 students in schools that are not meeting the minimum standards for a quality education, the legislature may wish to continue to follow this performance measurement. The Education and Local Government Interim Committee has included continued improvement in this measurement as part of the shared policy goals and accountability measurements for the 2013 biennium. The LFC workgroup may wish to concur with the recommendation fo the ELG.
