Performance Report:

- Supreme Court employee survey. The second annual employee survey was conducted June 2009. The results of the survey can be found at: http://courts.mt.gov/content/supreme/measures/employee_survey_results_final_july_2009. Compared to the 2008 baseline data, employees continue to be highly positive and satisfied regarding their employment with the Court.
- Supreme Court case processing measures. The reports for CY 2008 and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quarters of CY 2009 can be found at: http://courts.mt.gov/content/supreme/measures/2009_third_quarter_report.pdf.
- -- Clearance rate: Compared to the baseline data (3rd quarter, CY 2008), the Court's clearance rate -- the ratio of outgoing to incoming cases -- improved from 99% to 117% for 3rd quarter, CY 2009.
- -- Age of pending cases: The percentage of direct appeal cases less than 365 days old improved from 83% as of September 30, 2008 to 92% as of September 30, 2009.
- -- Time to disposition. The median length of time for the Court to dispose of a direct appeal case dropped from 259 days in 3rd quarter, CY 2008 to 145 days in 3rd quarter, CY 2009.
- District Court court user surveys. The court user survey has been successfully piloted in the following judicial districts: 9th (Pondera, Glacier, Teton, and Toole Counties), 10th (Fergus, Judith Basin, and Petroleum Counties), 11th (Flathead County), 13th (Yellowstone County), and 21st (Ravalli County).
