Pat,

We have data on your first question only for FY2010 because that is the first full year in which we had capability to extract the stats.

There were a total of 1,395 offenders with at least one non-probation sentence in FY2010. Of those, 273 (19.6%) went to prison. The remaining 1,122 (80.4%) were DOC commits.

The attached Powerpoint chart answers your second question as to where DOC commits eventually went. This has been and will be reported in the biennial report.


