Re: Report on ARRA Projects -

Water and Wastewater Infrastructure

The state received federal funds for the State Revolving Fund.

- The Federal Act required all money be obligated by February 17, 2010. <u>All</u>
 64 projects have signed construction contracts, have closed their loans and are
 drawing funds. Projects started on the ground work as early as July 2009.
 Some are in a winter shutdown and will be starting construction this spring.
 See spreadsheets attached.
- 2) Every project had a cap of \$750,000 in ARRA funds. The ARRA loans will have a little over 50% forgiven per loan. Once the work is complete their project will certify it is compliant with ARRA requirements and the amount of the loan to be forgiven will be processed. Therefore no appropriation for loan forgiveness has been expended to date. This process should start March 2010.
- 3) Water improvements: \$17.6 million ARRA funds leveraged into \$37.3 million of projects. These 32 projects replaced leaking distribution lines, repaired storage tanks, and installed water meters. See Exhibit A, 55% of loan will be forgiven.

Wastewater improvements: \$18.5 million in ARRA funds leveraged State, local, and other funds for \$68 million of projects. These 32 projects improved wastewater treatment plants, replaced lift stations, and installed storm sewers. See Exhibit B, 52% of the loan will be forgiven.
