

ARM Revisions for MFWP Commercial Wildlife

ALTERNATIVE LIVESTOCK (last revised 1/99)

Due to 1999 statutory changes (SB361)

- all references to "game farms" will be replaced with alternative livestock ranches or animals
- carnivores and omnivores will be removed from the ARM's
- renewal date will be changed to March 1 of each year (rather than January 31)
- "grace" period for renewal will be moved from April 1 to May 1 (need to specify action if a licensee does not renew by May 1 deadline)

Due to 2000 statutory changes (SB7 and I-143)

- section on new applications (12.6.1522) will be removed
- section on why modifications may be denied will be added (information had been included in 87-4-426 which was repealed)
- section on transfer of existing licenses (12.6.1523) will be removed
- section on environmental assessments for new applications (12.6.1525) will be removed
- a section clarifying the harvest of alternative livestock on a licensed facility will be added

MENAGERIES AND ZOOS (last revised 12/72 and 7/96)

Due to 1999 statutory changes (SB384)

- language will be added to include the categories of wild animal menageries and roadside menageries along with zoos rather than "roadside zoos"
- current policy on exhibition of animals outside of primary enclosures will be added to regulate that activity by roadside menageries and zoos
- insurance requirement minimums will be updated (last set for menageries 12/72)
- minimum standards for cages holding omnivores and carnivores will be added
- section on reporting of escapes and incidents will be added

SHOOTING PRESERVES (last revised 8/92) AND GAME BIRD FARMS (last revised 2/01)

Due to 2003 statutory changes (HB100) and Programmatic Environmental Impact

- quail removed from list of shooting preserve and game bird farm birds
- pheasants clarified as "ring-necked" pheasant
- merriams turkeys clarified rather than "turkeys" for shooting preserves
- license application section will be added for shooting preserves (appointment of a resident manager)
- shooting preserve permits clarified as non-transferrable
- game bird farm fees increased to \$100 application and \$50 renewal
- sections will be added for obtaining dog training permits (limit to 50 birds per year), permits to release ring-necks (200 maximum per year), and permit to possess game birds for non-commercial purposes
- National Poultry Improvement Plan requirements will be included for state bred birds
