

This is to request your concurrence that the following Agency Impact Determination is appropriate for the subject project.

This project begins at the outskirts of Circle and extends 10.5 miles toward Weldon on Secondary Route # 252 in McCone County. The project will follow on the existing graveled road.

The work to be performed will consist of some reshaping, minor grading including vertical curve corrections, examining the existing culverts for sufficient capacities and lengths, and the placing of a plant mix bituminous surfacing.

The project is not a major action and it is our opinion that the effects on the environment will be insignificant. Some traffic disruption will undoubtedly occur during the construction period however, it will last for only a short time. The major impact of the project will be to improve the riding quality of the road. The project should not significantly affect the air, noise or water quality of the area.
