Type and Purpose of Action: Operator has applied for an amendment to add 14.5 acres to the existing 8.0-acre permit for the purpose of expanding the mine area. The total permitted area would be 22.5 acres.

Site Description: The 14.5-acre proposed amendment area is an addition directly adjacent and to the south, north, and east of the existing permitted area. The operation would continue to mine to the south, north, and east. There are no site characteristics of special concern, nearby residences or public use areas. The Operator also holds a permit for mining this site issued by the Bureau of Land Management.

Potential Impacts and Mitigation: Use of the amendment area would not cause substantial impacts on the physical environment and human population. Proponent would be legally bound by their permit to reclaim the site to rangeland/pasture by July, 2044. The 1998 Environmental Assessment is applicable to this action.


