

AN ACT CLARIFYING WHICH COUNTIES MUST HAVE COUNTY AUDITORS AND WHICH COUNTIES MAY HAVE COUNTY AUDITORS; ALLOWING COMMISSIONERS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES THE DISCRETIONARY AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FOR AN ELECTED OR APPOINTED COUNTY AUDITOR; AMENDING SECTION 7-6-2401, MCA; AND REPEALING SECTION 7-6-2402, MCA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 7-6-2401, MCA, is amended to read:

"7-6-2401. Creation of office of county auditor. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), the <u>The</u> office of county auditor exists in all counties of the first, second, third, or fourth class <u>and having a population in excess</u> <u>of 15,000</u>.

(2) The provisions of 7-6-2401 through 7-6-2413 do not apply to <u>County commissioners in</u> counties having a population of less than 15,000 persons according to the most recent federal census to which subsection (1) does not apply may create a county auditor's position, either as a full-time or a part-time position or in <u>combination with another position pursuant to 7-4-2301</u>.

(3) The provisions of 7-6-2403 through 7-6-2412 do not apply to counties that do not have county auditors."

Section 2. Repealer. Section 7-6-2402, MCA, is repealed.
