A PROCLAMATION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF  
REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA  
March 7, 2005

WHEREAS, Lima High School is a high school of 35 students located in Southwestern Montana; and

WHEREAS, the eight members of the 2005 Lima High School senior class are Ryan Cherry, Riley Fitch, Farin Jackson, Cholpun Oskoeva, Jenna Schnitzler, Josh Slater, Tawnee Stosich, and Seth Young; and

WHEREAS these students -- who have been saving money for their senior trip since they were eighth graders -- unselfishly depleted their travel fund by giving \$5,000 to their ailing teacher, then donated additional money to this teacher to help with medical expenses, and shared another \$1,000 with a Dillon woman battling breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, these donations, which were made with no thought of personal gain, have come to the attention of people throughout the country, earning them a trip to Los Angeles to appear on The Ellen DeGeneres Show, a trip to the beach with Ms. DeGeneres, a tour of Hollywood locations, \$11,000 in donations from as far away as Florida to help fund the original senior trip to Oregon, a trip to Salt Lake City to shoot hoops with the Utah Jazz professional basketball team, and letters from both President George Bush and First Lady Laura Bush.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: That the thanks and warm regards of all Montanans be extended to the senior students of Lima High School for this display of unselfish sharing and their willingness to give up a special adventure in order to help a neighbor. These students have reminded all Americans about the joy of giving, sharing, and sacrificing for the good of others.
