In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments House Bill 9, "**AN ACT ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC PROJECTS GRANT AWARDS; APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC GRANTS; PROVIDING FOR A TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE STATE GENERAL FUND TO THE CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC TRUST FUND; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE,**" for the following reason.

My proposed amendment reduces the amount of money transferred from the state general fund to the cultural and aesthetic projects trust fund by \$500,000 in order to provide funding in HB 423 for a \$500,000 general fund appropriation for the Great Plains Dinosaur Park in Malta. In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments House Bill 172, "**AN ACT REVISING CERTAIN RESIDENT AND NONRESIDENT FISHING AND HUNTING LICENSE AND DRAWING FEES; CREATING A RESIDENT SENIOR COMBINATION LICENSE; AMENDING SECTIONS 87-2-113, 87-2-202, 87-2-301, 87-2-306, 87-2-401, 87-2-403, 87-2-411, 87-2-501, 87-2-505, 87-2-508, 87-2-510, 87-2-701, 87-2-704, 87-2-708, 87-2-711, 87-2-801, 87-2-803, AND 87-2-805, MCA; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED EFFECTIVE DATE,**" for the following reasons.

House Bill 172 revises resident and nonresident fishing and hunting license fees. I recognize that perhaps more than anything else, Montanans young and old, rich and poor, treasure their opportunity to fish the state's bountiful streams and lakes and hunt in the state's mountains and valleys, fields and plains. I share in the passion of Montanans to spend an evening on the river and to rise with the sun to hunt Montana's wildlife.

My proposed amendments to House Bill 172 lower the proposed increase in residential fishing license fees by \$2 and make slight adjustments to the nonresidential black bear fees in current law. Because of the large number of Montana anglers, my proposed amendments result in a savings to Montanans in excess of \$250,000. The amendments are attached to this letter.

In accordance with the powers vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 120, "A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: AN ACT REVISING AND EXTENDING THE UTILIZATION FEE ON HOSPITAL FACILITIES FOR INPATIENT BED DAYS INCLUDING CRITICAL ACCESS FACILITIES IN THE DEFINITION OF "HOSPITAL"; AMENDING SECTIONS 15-66-101, 15-66-102, AND 15-66-201, MCA, AND SECTION 20, CHAPTER 390, LAWS OF 2003; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND A TERMINATION DATE."

Health care for Montana citizens is of the utmost importance to my administration and I have pledged to work as hard as I can to ensure its availability, especially in our rural communities. But threats to that health care are on the horizon.

While I was attending the National Governor's Conference in Washington, DC in late February, President George W. Bush provided a stern warning, which he emphasized by pointing a finger at the Governors in attendance, expressing his objection to practices like Montana's hospital utilization fee. His administration has begun an effort to end widespread uses of such practices by the states. The President indicated that he was targeting \$40 billion in cuts in revenues that currently go to states, \$11 billion in intergovernmental transfers and \$6.9 billion in provider (hospital and nursing homes) fees, which are key to this hospital utilization fee.

Further, only half of the states have hospital utilization fees, such as those in SB 120, which further amplifies the current risk to Montana.

Because Montana's hospital utilization fee, as outlined in SB 120, is the kind of practice that was targeted by the President, it is essential that we structure the law to best meet Montana's medical care needs while at the same time providing the state's medical care providers with the strongest protection from negative action on the part of the federal government.

We need to do our best to meet the letter and spirit of the President's effort, but do so in a manner that protects the interests of Montana's medical care providers and Montana medical patients.

My analysis of the federal objections shows that the continuation of existing allocation language and practices related to the hospital utilization fee pose the greatest target for federal action.

I have determined that the best way to meet both of those important needs is to amend SB 120 to inoculate Montana from federal action by providing flexibility in the administration and uses of the hospital utilization fee.

Therefore, after extensive research and careful consideration of the problem, I propose the attached amendments, which:

- Allow the hospital utilization fees to be set as presently outlined in SB 120.
- Provide flexibility in allocation of the funds.
- Provide that the expenditure of funds under the law will be voided if the budget cap is legally determined to have been exceeded.

I respectfully request that the legislature agree to these amendments so that we may continue to see that Montanans can receive quality health care at the most affordable possible costs.

In accordance with the powers vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Montana, I hereby veto Senate Bill 153, "AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO REPORT TO AN APPROPRIATE LEGISLATIVE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON THE DEPARTMENT'S PROGRESS IN MEETING SPECIFIED GOALS AND PERFORMANCE INDICATORS AND TO POST THOSE GOALS AND PERFORMANCE INDICATORS ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE; ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT TO AMEND THOSE GOALS AND PERFORMANCE INDICATORS AND ITS PROGRESS REPORTS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS; SPECIFYING GOALS AND PERFORMANCE

While I share Senator Cobb’s objective of having performance measurements and goals for state agencies, three principles underline my veto action today.

First and foremost, the Department of Public Health and Human Services must keep its staff focused on the needs of the people they serve.

Second, generating a multitude of reports and paperwork that may not be needed for a particular purpose actually creates redundancy and takes away from effective government operations and customer service. DPHHS already produces a significant amount of statistical information that is adequate for future planning. This information is provided to interim committees of the legislature on a regular basis. It provides sufficient information to make appropriate decisions on future service needs and their effectiveness. DPHHS will continue to be responsive to the requests of legislative committees and provide information that can be readily obtained and that will assist the legislature, the executive branch and the public. Also, most, if not all, of the information is already available upon request from the Department of Public Health and Human Services.

Third, the executive branch understands and appreciates the need for legislative direction in the establishment of government programs, the persons to be served and the services provided. SB 153, however, is overly prescriptive and micromanages work that should be within the province of the executive agency.

Increasing efficiency in state agencies is a priority of my administration and I look forward to working with Senator Cobb and other members of the legislature in focusing on this task.

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 342, **“AN ACT CREATING AN ALTERNATIVE PROJECT DELIVERY CONTRACT PROCESS FOR CERTAIN CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS OF STATE AGENCIES AND CERTAIN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS; ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS THAT MUST BE MET IN ORDER TO USE AN ALTERNATIVE PROJECT DELIVERY CONTRACT; REQUIRING JUSTIFICATION FOR AN ALTERNATIVE PROJECT DELIVERY CONTRACT; REQUIRING A STATE AGENCY OR CERTAIN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS THAT USE AN ALTERNATIVE PROJECT DELIVERY CONTRACT TO STATE THE REASONS FOR SELECTING THE CONTRACTOR SELECTED; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 7-5-2301, 7-5-4302, 18-1-102, 18-2-103, 18-4-124, 20-6-606, 20-9-204, AND 67-11-201, MCA,”** for the following reasons.

Senator Laslovich requested the proposed amendment, at the request of the Department of Administration.

The proposed amendment makes the public notice requirements for alternative project delivery contracts entered by state agencies identical to the public notice requirements, generally, for state building construction contracts in excess of \$75,000, as provided in § 18-2-301, MCA. Under the bill in its current form, the public notice requirements for state contracts is expressed in two different ways, one of which, found in subsection (1)(a) of section 3 of the bill would require notice in eighty-four newspapers around the state. The Department of Administration projects that cost as \$15,000 per project. Under my proposed amendment, advertising would be required only in the seat of government and in the county where the work is to be performed. My proposed amendment also eliminates the inconsistency of the two notice requirements contained in the bill in its current form.

My proposed amendment also pertains to the definition of “request for qualifications” as used in section 3 of the bill. The bill adopts the definition for that term found in § 60-2-134, MCA. However, the definition of “request for qualifications” in 60-2-134 applies only to “design-build” contracts. Senate Bill 342 authorizes “construction management” contracts and “general contractor construction management” contracts, so the definition of “request for qualifications” contained in 60-2-134 is inconsistent with and contradictory to the remainder of Senate Bill 342.
