- (2) Except as provided in 17-2-108 and subsection (3) of this section, all money appropriated for the university of Montana campuses at Missoula, Butte, Dillon, and Helena and the Montana state university campuses at Bozeman, Billings, Havre, and Great Falls, the agricultural experiment station with central offices at Bozeman, the forest and conservation experiment station with central offices at Missoula, the cooperative extension service with central offices at Bozeman, and the bureau of mines and geology with central offices in Butte must, after the expiration of the time for which appropriated, revert to an account held by the board of regents. The board of regents is authorized to maintain a fund balance. There is a statutory appropriation, as provided in 17-7-502, to use the funds held in this account in accordance with a long-term plan for major and deferred maintenance expenditures and equipment or fixed assets purchases prepared by the affected university system units and approved by the board of regents. The affected university system units may, with the approval of the board of regents, modify the long-term plan at any time to address changing needs and priorities. The board of regents shall communicate the plan to each legislature, to the finance committee when requested by the committee, and to the office of budget and program planning.
- (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to reversions that are the result of a reduction in spending directed by the governor pursuant to 17-7-140. Any amount that is a result of a reduction in spending directed by the governor must revert to the fund or account from which it was originally appropriated.
- (4) After the end of a fiscal year, 30% of the money appropriated to an agency for that year by the general appropriations act for personal services, operating expenses, and equipment, by fund type, and remaining unexpended and unencumbered at the end of the year may be reappropriated to be spent during the following 2 years for any purpose that is consistent with the goals and objectives of the agency. The dollar amount of the 30% amount that may be carried forward and spent must be determined by the office of budget and program planning.""

MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

Dear President Tester and Speaker Matthews:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 428, "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A STATEWIDE 2-1-1 TELEPHONE NUMBER FOR ACCESS AND REFERRAL TO COMMUNITY DISASTER, EMERGENCY, SAFETY, HEALTH, AND HUMAN SERVICES INFORMATION; PROVIDING FOR A MONTANA 2-1-1 COMMUNITY COALITION TO SERVE IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY; PROVIDING THAT ANY AGENCY THAT SEEKS A NEW PUBLIC INFORMATION TELEPHONE LINE OR HOTLINE SHALL CONSULT WITH THE DEPARTMENT FOR USE OF THE 2-1-1 SYSTEM; PROVIDING FOR SERVICE PROVIDERS AND SCOPE OF SERVICE; PROVIDING FOR A STATE SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT; PROVIDING FOR ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES; REQUIRING BIENNIAL REPORTS TO THE LEGISLATURE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE" for the following reasons.

Senate Bill 428 establishes a 2-1-1 telephone number for public access to information and referral for safety, health, or human services and for information about access to services after a disaster or emergency. The bill directs the appointment of a twenty member coalition. Establishment of the 2-1-1 program will require the use of additional staff and impose additional expenses upon the Department of Public Health and Human Services ("DPHHS"). The fiscal note accompanying the bill explains that the new program would require an appropriation of \$63,000 over the next biennium.

However, section 11 of Senate Bill 428 directs that the new program be conducted with existing employees and within existing funding levels. This provision of Senate Bill 428 turns the bill into an unfunded mandate. Even the bill, in

its original form, recognized the need for funding, as it established a special account in the state special revenue fund (section 8 of the bill). DPHHS simply cannot establish this program with existing staff and funding levels.

My proposed amendment eliminates the requirement that the program operate within existing staffing and funding levels and, instead, provides the program shall not operate without an appropriation for that purpose. My proposed amendment is attached to this letter.

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 415, "AN ACT CREATING THE MONTANA RENEWABLE POWER PRODUCTION AND RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACT; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS; DEFINING TERMS; PROVIDING A GRADUATED RENEWABLE ENERGY STANDARD; AUTHORIZING ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES; PROVIDING A WAIVER PROCESS FOR PUBLIC UTILITIES; ESTABLISHING A PROCUREMENT PROCESS; AUTHORIZING ADVANCE APPROVAL OF CERTAIN PROCUREMENT CONTRACTS BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION; REQUIRING THE SUBMISSION OF PROCUREMENT PLANS; AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSION TO IMPLEMENT AND ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; PROVIDING THE COMMISSION WITH RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; EXEMPTING COOPERATIVE UTILITIES FROM THE GRADUATED RENEWABLE ENERGY STANDARD; REQUIRING CERTAIN COOPERATIVE UTILITIES TO IMPLEMENT AND ENFORCE THEIR OWN RENEWABLE ENERGY STANDARD; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE " for the following reasons.

It is vital that the State of Montana develop renewable energy. Renewable energy provides clear economic benefits to electricity consumers in the way of highly favorable prices, diversification of fuel supply, stabilization of rates, and mitigation of the risk of fuel price increases. In addition, the development of renewable energy across our vast state

blessed with an abundance of renewable resources will promote much needed local economic development in rural Montana.

In order to bring the advantages of renewable energy to Montana, I have supported legislation requiring that utilities be required to obtain a certain percentage of their energy supplies from renewable energy. I have also recognized, however, the importance of flexibility in complying with the applicable standards. Accordingly, I have supported allowing waivers from compliance in appropriate circumstances, such as in the highly unlikely event that the acquisition of renewable resources would jeopardize the reliability of the grid, or if the price of renewable energy is prohibitively expensive.

The passage of SB 415 is an important statement by the legislature of the State of Montana recognizing that renewable energy is a critical part of Montana's energy future, and I commend the Senate and House on its passage. I am concerned, however, that a particular aspect of SB 415 will cause the Act to fail to fully live up to its potential.

Section 7 of SB 415 establishes a confusing technical standard for addressing when renewable energy would not have to be acquired because of its cost. In fact, Section 7 creates two such standards: one for utilities that have restructured and one for utilities that have not restructured. In addition, Section 7 treats renewal energy differently than other types of energy production, and thus inappropriately and unduly discriminates against renewable energy.

I believe that in order to ensure that renewable resource development is promoted and not frustrated by a standard that is unfair and difficult to apply, it is advisable to amend SB 415 by clarifying the cost cap standard. I want to emphasize that the amendments I propose are consistent with the intent of Section 7, which is simply that when renewable energy is too expensive it does not need to be acquired.

The proposed amendments are straightforward. First and foremost, the amendments prevent adverse rate impacts to consumers. Second, in setting a cap for the price of renewable energy the Public Service Commission is required to take into account certain specified factors. These factors, such as ancillary services costs needed to integrate the renewable resource into the electrical system and the availability of tax credits, allow for the identification of the true costs of renewable energy to customers. In addition, the Commission would be required to consider the costs of alternative forms of generation so as to provide a valid basis of comparison with renewable resource costs. Third, the amendments provide additional protections to utilities by requiring that cost caps be developed using contested case proceedings.

I believe it is critical that the Public Service Commission be involved in this process. The Commission has the needed expertise to tackle these complex issues, and its record in seeking to safeguard the interests of ratepayers is longstanding and exemplary.

I respectfully request that the legislature agree to these proposed amendments so that the promise of renewable energy development and the benefits it offers can be realized in Montana.

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 293, "AN ACT REVISING LAWS RELATED TO ALTERNATIVE FUELS AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTS; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY TO ADOPT STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS ENSURING THAT CERTAIN TYPES OF GASOLINE SOLD TO CONSUMERS FOR USE IN MOTOR VEHICLES TO BE OPERATED ON PUBLIC ROADS IS BLENDED WITH ETHANOL AND PROVIDING THAT THE GASOLINE MAY NOT CONTAIN MORE THAN TRACE LEVELS OF METHYL TERTIARY BUTYL ETHER; REDUCING THE TAX INCENTIVE FROM 30 CENTS TO 20 CENTS PER GALLON; REVISING THE TIME IN WHICH TAX CREDITS MAY BE PAID; REDUCING THE AMOUNT OF PAYMENTS THAT MAY BE MADE TO AN ALCOHOL DISTRIBUTOR IN A CALENDAR YEAR FROM \$3 MILLION TO \$2 MILLION; PROVIDING FOR CONTRACTS FOR ETHANOL PRODUCERS ELIGIBLE FOR TAX INCENTIVES; REQUIRING AN ETHANOL PRODUCER TO USE AT LEAST A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF MONTANA PRODUCT IN ITS TOTAL PRODUCTION TO QUALIFY FOR THE TAX INCENTIVE; PROVIDING THAT AN ETHANOL FACILITY IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THE TAX INCENTIVE UNLESS THE FACILITY PAID A PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES DURING CONSTRUCTION; REVISING REQUIREMENTS FOR BUSINESS PLANS; REMOVING THE REQUIREMENT FOR LOSS OF PRIORITY; REVISING THE CONDITIONS FOR AN IN-STATE INVESTMENT FOR ALCOHOL PRODUCTION TO BE USED FOR FUEL; ALLOWING THE PAYMENT OF DIVIDENDS AND BONUSES UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS; CREATING CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS TO THE REQUIREMENT TO USE ETHANOL-BLENDED GASOLINE; REVISING THE CONTINGENCIES ELIMINATING THE PROVISIONS TAXING GASOHOL AT 85 PERCENT OF THE GASOLINE LICENSE TAX AND SPECIAL FUEL TAX RATES; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY AND THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY; REQUIRING THE BOARD OF ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW TO ADOPT RULES ESTABLISHING ALLOWABLE TRACE LEVELS OF METHYL TERTIARY BUTYL ETHER AND ESTABLISHING REPORTING AND SAMPLING REQUIREMENTS; AMENDING SECTIONS 15-70-201, 15-70-204, 15-70-503, 15-70-522, 17-6-317, 82-15-101, 82-15-102, 82-15-103, 82-15-104, 82-15-106, 82-15-110, AND 82-15-111, MCA, AND SECTIONS 12 AND 13, CHAPTER 568, LAWS OF 2001; REPEALING SECTION 15-70-245, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND TERMINATION DATES" for the following reasons.

This bill is the real deal. I commend Senator Black for his effort to make sure Montana does not lose the race in this key value added agricultural product. Working together I knew we could get ethanol legislation that will make a real difference for Montana's hard working families. The bottom line is this is good economic policy for the state, especially for rural Montana.

Senate Bill 293 sponsored by Senator Black is a bill that I strongly support. The bill is intended to encourage the

production of gasohol blended with Montana produced ethanol. These amendments make the bill easier to administer and strengthen the intent of the legislation.

In its current form, SB 293 does not address the intent to encourage the use of production of gasohol to the benefit of Montana producers. My proposed amendments delete the additional three month production rate for the trigger; takes the burden off of stations that blend to make mid-grade 87 octane and still allows 91 octane free ethanol and suspends the provisions in subsection (3)(c) for any year the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture declares any county in Montana a disaster area until August of the following year.

The sponsor of the bill approves of the amendments. The proposed amendments are attached to this letter.
