BY REQUEST OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY COUNCIL

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT EXEMPTING DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION FIRE SUPPRESSION ACTIVITIES FROM REVIEW UNDER THE MONTANA ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT; AMENDING SECTION 75-1-104, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Department exempt from Montana Environmental Policy Act review when suppressing fire. (1) The department is exempt from the provisions of Title 75, chapter 1, parts 1 and 2, when engaging in fire suppression pursuant to part 2 and this part.

- (2) For the purposes of this section, "fire suppression" means work and activities connected with control and fire-extinguishing operations, beginning with discovery of the fire and continuing until the fire is completely extinguished.
 - **Section 2.** Section 75-1-104, MCA, is amended to read:
- **"75-1-104. Specific statutory obligations unimpaired <u>-- exemption from act</u>. (1) Sections 75-1-103 and 75-1-201 do not affect the specific statutory obligations of any agency of the state to:**
 - (1)(a) comply with criteria or standards of environmental quality;
 - (2)(b) coordinate or consult with any local government, other state agency, or federal agency; or
- (3)(c) act or refrain from acting contingent upon the recommendations or certification of any other state or federal agency.
- (2) The provisions of part 2 and this part do not apply to the department of natural resources and conservation when the department is engaging in fire suppression, as provided in [section 1]."

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Section 3. Codification instruction.** [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 76, chapter 13, part 1, and the provisions of Title 76, chapter 13, part 1, apply to [section 1].
