Dear President Story and Speaker Bergren:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 465, "AN ACT REVISING AND CLARIFYING THE LAWS RELATED TO THE TREATMENT OF PROPERTY CONSISTING OF THE BED OF NAVIGABLE RIVERS AND STREAMS; PROVIDING FOR A REDUCTION FROM GRAZING LAND BEFORE A REDUCTION FROM CURRENT LAND USE FOR PROPERTY TAX PURPOSES; PROVIDING THAT IN A DISPUTE OVER THE OWNERSHIP OF THE BED OF A RIVER OR STREAM A PRESUMPTION MAY NOT BE MADE BASED UPON THE TAX STATUS OF THE PROPERTY; CLARIFYING THE OWNERSHIP OF STRUCTURES; CLARIFYING THE ABILITY TO CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS; AMENDING SECTIONS 61-8-371, 77-1-

111, 77-1-126, 77-1-127, 77-1-806, 77-1-809, 77-3-442, 77-6-113, 77-6-115, 77-6-302, 77-6-303, AND 77-6-501, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND A RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY DATE" for the following reasons:

Senate Bill 465, sponsored by Senator Hamlett, concerns the subject of navigable streambeds in areas including but not limited to taxation, irrigation structures, weed control, and others. Concerning the subject of taxation, in 2008, with new technology available and in consultation with the Revenue and Transportation Interim Committee, the Department of Revenue for the first time excluded from property taxation land underlying rivers or streams that the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation ("DNRC") considered to be owned by the State of Montana based on the type of evidence used by courts in determining navigability of rivers and streams for purposes of title.

An unexpected consequence was that certain property owners believed the Department of Revenue was acting to assert ownership of land never previously adjudicated as having been in state ownership. Among other things, Senate Bill 465 prohibits the Department of Revenue from treating land underlying streams and rivers as in state ownership unless the land has been adjudicated as owned by the state or the state is the owner of record of the property.

As passed, Senate Bill 465 includes a retroactive applicability clause, the effect of which would be to require reassessment of *all* stream beds exempted in 2008, except those stream beds previously adjudicated as navigable. Instead of requiring reassessment of *all* stream beds, my amendment would require retroactive reassessment only if the landowner made that choice. Under my amendment, the Department of Revenue will be required to notify landowners of their right to request a reassessment for 2008, and for those who so request, allow those landowners to pay taxes on the beds of the rivers and streams neither adjudicated or surveyed as navigable.

I have also included an additional minor amendment to the "whereas" provisions of the bill, to recognize that the DNRC has regulatory authority not only over the beds of rivers and streams adjudicated as navigable, but also over those stream beds determined navigable through federal surveys of the meander lines.

I have discussed these amendments with the sponsor of the bill, Senator Hamlett, who has indicated his support.

MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

Dear President Story and Speaker Bergren:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return with amendments Senate Bill 349, "AN ACT CLARIFYING THAT CERTAIN

CONFIDENTIAL OR PROPRIETARY INFORMATION SUBMITTED AS PART OF THE PUBLIC BIDDING OR PUBLIC CONTRACTING PROCESS FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC BUILDING AND PUBLIC HIGHWAY, ROAD, AND SIMILAR TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS IS NOT PUBLIC INFORMATION OPEN TO PUBLIC INSPECTION; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 18-2-503, 18-4-126, AND 60-2-137, MCA" for the following reasons.

Senate Bill 349, sponsored by Senator Tutvedt, was introduced to address a perceived problem that state agencies will treat protected information, such as trade secret information, submitted to state agencies under Montana's procurement laws as though that information is public information. Senate Bill 349 was written to ensure that protected information is not disseminated by state agencies. The bill amends Montana procurement and construction statutes administered by the Department of Administration and also amends design-build statutes under laws administered by the Department of Transportation.

My objection to Senate Bill 349 is twofold. First, it reverses the "constitutional presumption that all documents of every kind in the hands of public officials are amendable to inspection, regardless of legislation. . . ." Great Falls Tribune v. Montana Public Service Commission, 2003 MT 359, ¶ 54, quoting Associated Press, Inc. v. Montana Department of Revenue, 2000 MT 160, ¶ 85. Second, it conflicts with current procurement statutes under Title 18, chapter 4, MCA.

Regarding the constitutional presumption, the *Great Falls Tribune* decision set forth the proper procedure to be used by state agencies that have in their possession information considered to be confidential. Specifically, the court rejected any conclusory, generalized statements that information is subject to protection ("mere representations" not sufficient), and required parties to make a particularized showing, through the submission of a supporting affidavit, and agencies to make particularized findings related to the claim of confidentiality. As stated by the court: "The claimant's showing must be more than conclusory. It must be specific enough for the [agency], any objecting parties, and reviewing authorities to clearly understand the nature and basis of the . . . claims to the right of confidentiality." The court also held that the governmental agency had the "affirmative duty" to review the claim of the third party and make an "independent determination whether the records are in fact property rights which warrant due process protection. . . ." Id. at ¶¶ 55-57. The court also clarified, however, that if the government agency requires the filing or production of trade secrets or other confidential information, "the information's status as a trade secret or confidential proprietary information remains unchanged." Id. at ¶ 60.

My concern with Senate Bill 349, as presented to me, is that the amendments to § 18-4-126, MCA, found in section 2 of the bill, authorize a blanket presumption of confidentiality based on the conclusory identification of the information as trade secret information by the person submitting the information, and this standard does not meet the detailed requirements set forth in *Great Falls Tribune*.

Regarding the conflict with other statutes, § 18-4-304, MCA (which is part of Montana's procurement code, and is not amended in Senate Bill 349), provides that "proposal documents may be inspected by the public subject to [three specific limitations]": matters covered by the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, matters involving individual safety as determined by the Department of Administration, and other constitutional protections. My amendments to section 3 of the bill (the new section, which will be renumbered section 1 if you adopt my amendments) track the language and exceptions already contained in current law, in § 18-4-304, MCA, and eliminate the conflict contained in the bill.

Finally, I want you to know that the Department of Administration already has in place procedures comporting with the decision of the court in *Great Falls Tribune* allowing parties submitting confidential, trade secret information in the procurement process to make a particularized showing of confidentiality by affidavit. The Department's "Affidavit for Trade Secret Confidentiality" is located at http://gsd.mt.gov/docs/Tradesecretaffidavit.doc. A vendor must attach, through a separate affidavit, a particularized explanation of the validity of the trade secret claim.

My amendments to Senate Bill 349 would require the Department of Transportation to adopt a procedure similar to that used by the Department of Administration.

I ask for your support of these amendments.
