

HOUSE BILL NO. 277

INTRODUCED BY T. WASHBURN

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING A LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF GOLF CARTS ON PUBLIC STREETS OR HIGHWAYS; DEFINING "GOLF CART"; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 61-1-101 AND 61-12-101, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Unlawful operation of golf cart -- exception -- required equipment. (1)

A person may not operate a golf cart on a public street or highway open to the public unless the operation is specifically authorized by ordinance or regulation passed by the local governing body of the county, city, or town for a public street or highway under its jurisdiction.

(2) A golf cart may not be operated on a public street or highway when permitted by this section unless it is equipped with:

- (a) at least one and not more than two headlamps;
- (b) at least one taillamp;
- (c) at least one reflector;
- (d) stop lamps;
- (e) a horn; and
- (f) a mirror that reflects to the driver a view of the highway.

Section 2. Section 61-1-101, MCA, is amended to read:

"61-1-101. Definitions. As used in this title, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following definitions apply:

(1) (a) "Authorized agent" means a person who has executed a written agreement with the department and is specifically authorized by the department to electronically access and update the department's motor vehicle titling, registration, or driver records, using an approved automated interface, for specific functions or purposes upon behalf of a third party.

(b) For purposes of this subsection (1), "person" means an individual, corporation, partnership, limited



1 partnership, limited liability company, association, joint venture, state agency, local government unit, another state
2 government, the United States, a political subdivision of this or another state, or any other legal or commercial
3 entity.

4 (2) "Authorized agent agreement" means the written agreement executed between an authorized agent
5 and the department that sets the technical and operational program standards, compliance criteria, payment
6 options, and service expectations by which the authorized agent is required to operate in performing specific
7 motor vehicle or driver-related record functions.

8 (3) "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying more than 10 passengers and used for the
9 transportation of persons and any other motor vehicle, other than a taxicab, designed and used for the
10 transportation of persons for compensation.

11 (4) (a) "Business entity" means a corporation, association, partnership, limited liability partnership, limited
12 liability company, or other legal entity recognized under state law.

13 (b) The term does not include an individual.

14 (5) (a) "Camper" means a structure designed to be mounted in the cargo area of a truck or attached to
15 an incomplete vehicle for the purpose of providing shelter for persons. The term includes but is not limited to a
16 cab-over, half cab-over, noncab-over, telescopic, and telescopic cab-over.

17 (b) The term does not include a truck canopy cover or topper.

18 (6) "Certificate of title" means the paper record issued by the department or by the appropriate agency
19 of another jurisdiction that establishes a verifiable record of ownership between an identified person or persons
20 and the motor vehicle specifically described in the record and that provides notice of a perfected security interest
21 in the motor vehicle.

22 (7) "Commercial driver's license" means:

23 (a) a driver's license issued under or granted by the laws of this state that authorizes a person to operate
24 a class of commercial motor vehicle; and

25 (b) the privilege of a person to drive a commercial motor vehicle, whether or not the person holds a valid
26 commercial driver's license.

27 (8) (a) "Commercial motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle or combination of motor vehicles used in
28 commerce to transport passengers or property if the vehicle:

29 (i) has a gross combination weight rating or a gross combination weight of 26,001 pounds or more,
30 whichever is greater, inclusive of a towed unit with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds;

- 1 (ii) has a gross vehicle weight rating or a gross vehicle weight of 26,001 pounds or more, whichever is
2 greater;
- 3 (iii) is designed to transport at least 16 passengers, including the driver;
- 4 (iv) is a school bus; or
- 5 (v) is of any size and is used in the transportation of hazardous materials as defined in 61-8-801.
- 6 (b) The following vehicles are not commercial motor vehicles:
- 7 (i) an authorized emergency service vehicle:
- 8 (A) equipped with audible and visual signals as required under 61-9-401 and 61-9-402; and
- 9 (B) entitled to the exemptions granted under 61-8-107;
- 10 (ii) a vehicle:
- 11 (A) controlled and operated by a farmer, family member of the farmer, or person employed by the farmer;
- 12 (B) used to transport farm products, farm machinery, or farm supplies to or from the farm within Montana
13 within 150 miles of the farm or, if there is a reciprocity agreement with a state adjoining Montana, within 150 miles
14 of the farm, including any area within that perimeter that is in the adjoining state; and
- 15 (C) not used to transport goods for compensation or for hire; or
- 16 (iii) a vehicle operated for military purposes by active duty military personnel, a member of the military
17 reserves, a member of the national guard on active duty, including personnel on full-time national guard duty,
18 personnel in part-time national guard training, and national guard military technicians, or active duty United States
19 coast guard personnel.
- 20 (c) For purposes of this subsection (8):
- 21 (i) "farmer" means a person who operates a farm or who is directly involved in the cultivation of land or
22 crops or the raising of livestock owned by or under the direct control of that person;
- 23 (ii) "gross combination weight rating" means the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight
24 of a combination or articulated vehicle;
- 25 (iii) "gross vehicle weight rating" means the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight of
26 a single vehicle; and
- 27 (iv) "school bus" has the meaning provided in 49 CFR 383.5.
- 28 (9) "Commission" means the state transportation commission.
- 29 (10) "Custom-built motorcycle" means a motorcycle that is equipped with:
- 30 (a) an engine that was manufactured 20 years prior to the current calendar year and that has been

1 altered from the manufacturer's original design;

2 (b) an engine that was manufactured to resemble an engine 20 or more years old and that has been
3 constructed in whole or in part from nonoriginal materials.

4 (11) "Custom vehicle" means a motor vehicle other than a motorcycle that:

5 (a) (i) was manufactured with a model year after 1948 and that is at least 25 years old; or

6 (ii) was built to resemble a vehicle manufactured after 1948 and at least 25 years before the current
7 calendar year, including a kit vehicle intended to resemble a vehicle manufactured after 1948 and that is at least
8 25 years old; and

9 (b) has been altered from the manufacturer's original design or has a body constructed from nonoriginal
10 materials.

11 (12) "Customer identification number" means:

12 (a) a driver's license or identification card number when the customer is an individual who has been
13 issued a driver's license or identification card by a state driver licensing authority;

14 (b) a federal employer or tax identification number when the customer is a business entity that has been
15 issued a federal employer or tax identification number;

16 (c) the identification number assigned by the secretary of state to a business entity authorized to do
17 business in this state under Title 35 if the customer is a business entity that does not have a federal employer
18 or tax identification number other than a social security number; or

19 (d) if the customer has not been issued one of the numbers described in subsections (12)(a) through
20 (12)(c), a number assigned to the customer by the department when a transaction is initiated under this title.

21 (13) (a) "Dealer" means a person that, for commission or profit, engages in whole or in part in the
22 business of buying, selling, exchanging, or accepting on consignment new or used motor vehicles, trailers,
23 semitrailers, pole trailers, travel trailers, motorboats, sailboats, snowmobiles, off-highway vehicles, or special
24 mobile equipment that is not registered in the name of the person.

25 (b) The term does not include the following:

26 (i) receivers, trustees, administrators, executors, guardians, or other persons appointed by or acting
27 under a judgment or order of any court of competent jurisdiction;

28 (ii) employees of the persons included in subsection (13)(b)(i) when engaged in the specific performance
29 of their duties as employees; or

30 (iii) public officers while performing or in the operation of their duties.

1 (14) "Declared weight" means the total unladen weight of a vehicle plus the weight of the maximum load
2 to be carried on the vehicle as stated by the registrant in the application for registration.

3 (15) "Department" means the department of justice acting directly or through its duly authorized officers
4 or agents.

5 (16) "Dolly or converter gear" means a device consisting of one or two axles with a fifth wheel and trailer
6 tongue used to support the forward end of a semitrailer, converting a semitrailer into a trailer.

7 (17) "Domiciled" means a place where:

8 (a) an individual establishes residence;

9 (b) a business entity maintains its principal place of business;

10 (c) the business entity's registered agent maintains an address; or

11 (d) a business entity most frequently uses, dispatches, or controls a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer,
12 or pole trailer that it owns or leases.

13 (18) "Driver" means a person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

14 (19) "Driver's license" means a license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under or granted by
15 the laws of this state, including:

16 (a) any temporary license or instruction permit;

17 (b) the privilege of any person to drive a motor vehicle, whether or not the person holds a valid license;

18 (c) any nonresident's driving privilege;

19 (d) a motorcycle endorsement; or

20 (e) a commercial driver's license.

21 (20) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a device that has two nontandem wheels, is
22 self-balancing, and is designed to transport only one person with an electric propulsion system that limits the
23 maximum speed of the device to 12 1/2 miles an hour.

24 (21) "For hire" means an action performed for remuneration of any kind, whether paid or promised, either
25 directly or indirectly, or received or obtained through leasing, brokering, or buy-and-sell arrangements from which
26 a remuneration is obtained or derived for transportation service.

27 (22) "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that is designed for use on a golf course to carry a person or
28 persons and golf equipment and that has an average speed of less than 15 miles per hour.

29 ~~(22)~~(23) "Gross vehicle weight" means the weight of a vehicle without load plus the weight of any load
30 on the vehicle.

1 ~~(23)~~(24) "Highway" or "public highway" means the entire width between the boundary lines of every
2 publicly maintained way when any part of the publicly maintained way is open to the use of the public for purposes
3 of vehicular travel.

4 ~~(24)~~(25) "Highway patrol officer" means a state officer authorized to direct or regulate traffic or to make
5 arrests for violations of traffic regulations.

6 ~~(25)~~(26) "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle that is designed for agricultural purposes and
7 exclusively used by the owner of the vehicle in the conduct of the owner's agricultural operations.

8 ~~(26)~~(27) "Kit vehicle" is a motor vehicle assembled from a manufactured kit either as:

9 (a) a complete kit, consisting of a prefabricated body and chassis, to construct a new motor vehicle; or

10 (b) a kit with a prefabricated body to be mounted to an existing motor vehicle chassis and drivetrain,
11 commonly referred to as a donor vehicle.

12 ~~(27)~~(28) "Light vehicle" means a motor vehicle commonly referred to as an automobile, van, sport utility
13 vehicle, or truck having a manufacturer's rated capacity of 1 ton or less.

14 ~~(28)~~(29) "Manufactured home" has the meaning provided in 15-24-201.

15 ~~(29)~~(30) "Manufacturer" includes any person engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers,
16 semitrailers, pole trailers, travel trailers, motorboats, sailboats, snowmobiles, or off-highway vehicles as a regular
17 business.

18 ~~(30)~~(31) "Manufacturer's certificate of origin" means the original paper record produced and issued by
19 the manufacturer of a vehicle or, if in a medium authorized by the department, an electronic record created and
20 transmitted by the manufacturer of a vehicle to the manufacturer's agent or a licensed dealer. The record must
21 establish the origin of the vehicle specifically described in the record and, upon assignment, transfers of
22 ownership of the vehicle to the person or persons named in the certificate.

23 ~~(31)~~(32) (a) "Medium-speed electric vehicle" is a motor vehicle, upon or by which a person may be
24 transported, that:

25 (i) has a maximum speed of 45 miles an hour as certified by the manufacturer;

26 (ii) is propelled by its own power, using an electric motor or other device that transforms stored electrical
27 energy into the motion of the vehicle;

28 (iii) stores electricity in batteries, ultracapacitors, or similar devices, which are charged from the power
29 grid or from renewable electrical energy sources;

30 (iv) is fully enclosed and includes at least one door for entry;

- 1 (v) has a wheelbase of 40 inches or greater and a wheel diameter of 10 inches or greater;
- 2 (vi) exhibits a manufacturer's compliance with 49 CFR, part 565, or displays a 17-character vehicle
3 identification number as provided in 49 CFR, part 565;
- 4 (vii) bears a sticker, affixed by the manufacturer or dealer, on the left side of the rear window that
5 indicates the vehicle's maximum speed rating; and
- 6 (viii) as certified by the manufacturer, is equipped as provided in 61-9-432.
- 7 (b) A medium-speed electric vehicle must be treated as a light vehicle for purposes of titling and
8 registration under Title 61, chapter 3.
- 9 (c) A medium-speed electric vehicle may not have a gross vehicle weight in excess of 5,000 pounds.
- 10 ~~(32)~~(33) "Mobile home" or "housetrailer" has the meaning provided in 15-24-201.
- 11 ~~(33)~~(34) "Montana resident" means:
- 12 (a) an individual who resides in Montana as determined under 1-1-215;
- 13 (b) for the purposes of chapter 3, a business entity that maintains a principal place of business or a
14 registered agent in this state.
- 15 ~~(34)~~(35) (a) "Motorboat" means a vessel, including a personal watercraft or pontoon, propelled by any
16 machinery, motor, or engine of any description, whether or not the machinery, motor, or engine is the principal
17 source of propulsion. The term includes boats temporarily equipped with detachable motors or engines.
- 18 (b) The term does not include a vessel that has a valid marine document issued by the U.S. coast guard
19 or any successor federal agency.
- 20 ~~(35)~~(36) (a) "Motor carrier" means a person or corporation or its lessees, trustees, or receivers appointed
21 by a court that are operating motor vehicles upon a public highway in this state for the transportation of property
22 for hire on a commercial basis.
- 23 (b) The term does not include motor carriers regulated under Title 69, chapter 12.
- 24 ~~(36)~~(37) (a) "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that has a seat or saddle for the use of the operator and
25 that is designated to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground. A motorcycle may carry one
26 or more attachments and a seat for the conveyance of a passenger.
- 27 (b) The term does not include a tractor, a bicycle as defined in 61-8-102, a motorized nonstandard
28 vehicle, or a two- or three-wheeled all-terrain vehicle that is used exclusively on private property.
- 29 ~~(37)~~(38) (a) "Motor-driven cycle" means a motorcycle, including a motor scooter, with a motor that
30 produces 5 horsepower or less.

- 1 (b) The term does not include a bicycle, as defined in 61-8-102, or a motorized nonstandard vehicle.
- 2 ~~(38)~~(39) "Motor home" means a motor vehicle:
- 3 (a) designed to provide temporary living quarters, built as an integral part of or permanently attached to
- 4 a self-propelled motor vehicle chassis or van;
- 5 (b) containing permanently installed independent life support systems that meet the ANSIA/A119.2
- 6 standard; and
- 7 (c) providing at least four of the following types of facilities:
- 8 (i) cooking, refrigeration, or icebox;
- 9 (ii) self-contained toilet;
- 10 (iii) heating or air conditioning, or both;
- 11 (iv) potable water supply, including a faucet and sink; or
- 12 (v) separate 110-volt or 125-volt electrical power supply or a liquefied petroleum gas supply; or both.
- 13 ~~(39)~~(40) (a) "Motorized nonstandard vehicle" means a vehicle, upon or by which a person may be
- 14 transported, that:
- 15 (i) is propelled by its own power, using an internal combustion engine or an electric motor;
- 16 (ii) has a wheelbase of less than 40 inches and a wheel diameter of less than 10 inches; and
- 17 (iii) does not display a manufacturer's certification in accordance with 49 CFR, part 567, or have a
- 18 17-character vehicle identification number assigned by the manufacturer in accordance with 49 CFR, part 565.
- 19 (b) The term includes but is not limited to a motorized skateboard and a vehicle commonly known as a
- 20 "pocket rocket".
- 21 (c) The term does not include an electric personal assistive mobility device or a motorized wheelchair
- 22 or other low-powered, mechanically propelled vehicle designed specifically for use by a physically disabled
- 23 person.
- 24 ~~(40)~~(41) (a) "Motor vehicle" means:
- 25 (i) a vehicle propelled by its own power and designed or used to transport persons or property upon the
- 26 highways of the state; and
- 27 (ii) a quadricycle if it is equipped for use on the highways as prescribed in chapter 9.
- 28 (b) The term does not include a bicycle as defined in 61-8-102, an electric personal assistive mobility
- 29 device, a motorized nonstandard vehicle, a golf cart, or a motorized wheelchair or other low-powered,
- 30 mechanically propelled vehicle that is designed specifically for use by a physically disabled person and that is

1 used as a means of mobility for that person.

2 ~~(41)~~(42) "New motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle, regardless of the mileage of the vehicle, the legal
3 or equitable title to which has never been transferred by a manufacturer, distributor, or dealer to another person
4 as the result of a retail sale.

5 ~~(42)~~(43) "Nonresident" means a person who is not a Montana resident.

6 ~~(43)~~(44) (a) "Not used for general transportation purposes" means the operation of a motor vehicle,
7 registered as a collector's item, a custom vehicle, a street rod, or a custom-built motorcycle to or from a car or
8 motorcycle club activity or event or an exhibit, show, cruise night, or parade, or other occasional transportation
9 activity.

10 (b) The term does not include operation of a motor vehicle for routine or ordinary household
11 maintenance, employment, education, or other similar purposes.

12 ~~(44)~~(45) (a) "Off-highway vehicle" means a self-propelled vehicle designed for recreation or cross-country
13 travel on public lands, trails, easements, lakes, rivers, or streams. The term includes but is not limited to
14 motorcycles, quadricycles, dune buggies, amphibious vehicles, air cushion vehicles, and any other means of land
15 transportation deriving motive power from any source other than muscle or wind.

16 (b) The term does not include:

17 (i) vehicles designed primarily for travel on, over, or in the water;

18 (ii) snowmobiles; or

19 (iii) motor vehicles designed to transport persons or property upon the highways unless the vehicle is
20 used for off-road recreation on public lands.

21 ~~(45)~~(46) "Operator" means a person who is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle.

22 ~~(46)~~(47) "Owner" means a person who holds the legal title to a vehicle. If a vehicle is the subject of an
23 agreement for the conditional sale of the vehicle with the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions
24 stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested in the conditional vendee, or in the
25 event a vehicle is subject to a lease, contract, or other legal arrangement vesting right of possession or control,
26 for security or otherwise, or in the event a mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession, then the owner is the
27 person in whom is vested the right of possession or control.

28 ~~(47)~~(48) "Person" means an individual, corporation, partnership, association, firm, or other legal entity.

29 ~~(48)~~(49) "Personal watercraft" means a vessel that uses an outboard motor or an inboard engine
30 powering a water jet pump as its primary source of propulsion and that is designed to be operated by a person

1 sitting, standing, or kneeling on the vessel rather than by the conventional method of sitting or standing in the
2 vessel.

3 ~~(49)~~(50) "Pole trailer" means a vehicle without power designed to be drawn by another vehicle and
4 attached to the towing vehicle by means of a reach or pole or by being boomed or otherwise secured to the
5 towing vehicle and ordinarily used for transporting long or irregularly shaped loads such as poles, pipes, or
6 structural members capable generally of sustaining themselves as beams between the supporting connections.

7 ~~(50)~~(51) "Police officer" means an officer authorized to direct or regulate traffic or to make arrests for
8 violations of traffic regulations.

9 ~~(54)~~(52) (a) "Quadricycle" means a four-wheeled motor vehicle, designed for on-road or off-road use,
10 having a seat or saddle upon which the operator sits and a motor capable of producing not more than 50
11 horsepower.

12 (b) The term does not include golf carts.

13 ~~(52)~~(53) "Railroad" means a carrier of persons or property upon cars, other than streetcars, operated
14 upon stationary rails.

15 ~~(53)~~(54) (a) "Railroad train" or "train" means a steam engine or electric or other motor, with or without cars
16 coupled to the engine, that is operated upon rails.

17 (b) The term does not include streetcars.

18 ~~(54)~~(55) "Recreational vehicle" includes a motor home, travel trailer, or camper.

19 ~~(55)~~(56) "Registration" or "register" means the act or process of creating an electronic record, maintained
20 by the department, of the assignment of a license plate or a set of license plates to and the issuance of a
21 registration decal for a specific vehicle, the ownership of which has been established or is presumed in
22 department records.

23 ~~(56)~~(57) "Registration decal" means an adhesive sticker produced by the department and issued by the
24 department, its authorized agent, or a county treasurer to the owner of a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, pole
25 trailer, motorboat, sailboat, personal watercraft, or snowmobile as proof of payment of all fees imposed for the
26 registration period indicated on the sticker as recorded by the department under 61-3-101.

27 ~~(57)~~(58) "Registration receipt" means a paper record that is produced and issued or, if authorized by the
28 department, an electronic record that is transmitted by the department, its authorized agent, or a county treasurer
29 to the owner of a vehicle that identifies a vehicle, based on information maintained in the electronic record of title
30 for the vehicle, and that provides evidence of the payment of all fees required to be paid for the registration of the

1 vehicle for the registration period indicated in the receipt.

2 ~~(58)~~(59) "Retail sale" means the sale of a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer, travel trailer,
3 motorboat, snowmobile, off-highway vehicle, or special mobile equipment by a dealer to a person for purposes
4 other than resale.

5 ~~(59)~~(60) "Revocation" means the termination by action of the department of a person's driver's license,
6 privilege to drive a motor vehicle on the public highways, and privilege to apply for and be issued a driver's license
7 for a period of time designated by law, during which the license or privilege may not be renewed, restored, or
8 exercised. An application for a new license may be presented and acted upon by the department after the
9 expiration of the period of the revocation.

10 ~~(60)~~(61) "Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular
11 travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder. In the event that a highway includes two or more separate roadways,
12 the term refers to any roadway separately but not to all roadways collectively.

13 ~~(64)~~(62) (a) "Sailboat" means a vessel that uses a sail and wind as its primary source of propulsion.

14 (b) The term does not include a canoe or kayak propelled by wind.

15 ~~(62)~~(63) "School zone" means an area near a school beginning at the school's front door, encompassing
16 the campus and school property, and including the streets directly adjacent to the school property and for as
17 many blocks surrounding the school as determined by the local authority establishing a special speed limit under
18 61-8-310(1)(d).

19 ~~(63)~~(64) "Sell" means to transfer ownership from one person to another person or from a dealer to
20 another person for consideration.

21 ~~(64)~~(65) "Semitrailer" means a vehicle, with or without motive power, other than a pole trailer, designed
22 for carrying property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and constructed so that some part of its weight and
23 that of its load rests upon or is carried by another vehicle.

24 ~~(65)~~(66) "Snowmobile" means a self-propelled vehicle of an overall width of 48 inches or less, excluding
25 accessories, that is designed primarily for travel on snow or ice, that may be steered by skis or runners, and that
26 is not otherwise registered or licensed under the laws of the state of Montana.

27 ~~(66)~~(67) "Special mobile equipment" means a vehicle not designed for the transportation of persons or
28 property on the highways but incidentally operated or moved over the highways, including road construction or
29 maintenance machinery, ditch-digging apparatus, and well-boring apparatus. The fact that equipment is
30 permanently attached to a vehicle does not make the vehicle special mobile equipment. The enumeration in this

1 subsection is partial and does not exclude other vehicles that are within the general terms of this subsection.

2 ~~(67)~~(68) (a) "Specially constructed vehicle" means a motor vehicle, including a motorcycle, that:

3 (i) was not originally constructed under a distinctive make, model, or type by a generally recognized
4 manufacturer of motor vehicles;

5 (ii) has been structurally modified so that it does not have the same appearance as similar vehicles from
6 a generally recognized manufacturer of motor vehicles;

7 (iii) has been constructed or assembled entirely from custom-built parts and materials not obtained from
8 other vehicles;

9 (iv) has been constructed or assembled by using major component parts from one or more manufactured
10 vehicles and that cannot be identified as a specific make or model; or

11 (v) has been constructed by the use of a kit that cannot be visually identified as a specific make or model.

12 (b) The term does not include a motor vehicle that has been repaired or restored to its original design
13 by replacing parts.

14 ~~(68)~~(69) (a) "Sport utility vehicle" means a light vehicle designed to transport 10 or fewer persons that
15 is constructed on a truck chassis or that has special features for occasional off-road use.

29 **"61-12-101. Powers of local authorities to regulate traffic.** The provisions of chapters 8 and 9 do not
30 prevent local authorities with respect to sidewalks, streets, and highways under their jurisdiction and within the

- 3 (2) regulating the traffic by means of police officers or traffic control devices;

- 9 stop before entering or crossing a through highway and designating any intersection, as defined in 61-8-102, as
- 10 a stop intersection and requiring all vehicles to stop at one or more entrances to stop intersections;

- 12 (8) regulating the operation of bicycles, as defined in 61-8-102, and requiring the registration and
- 13 licensing of bicycles, including requiring a registration fee;
