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| 12 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: |
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| 14 | NEW SECTION. Section 1. Farm-to-school grant program. (1) A school district may apply to the |
| 15 | office of public instruction for a grant to be used by the school district to: |
| 16 | (a) reimburse the school district for costs incurred by the school district in purchasing Montana food |
| 17 | products described in subsection (3); and |
| 18 | (b) fund food-based, agriculture-based, and garden-based educational activities in the school district. |
| 19 | (2) For a grant received under this section: |
| 20 | (a) 85% of the money from the grant must be used for the purpose of subsection (1)(a); and |
| 21 | (b) 15% of the money from the grant must be used for educational activities under subsection (1)(b). |
| 22 | (3) (a) For the portion of a grant that is allocated for procurement of food products, a school district must |
| 23 | be supported for the costs incurred by the school district in purchasing Montana food products that were: |
| 24 | (i) purchased on or after the date the school district received the money for the grant; |
| 25 | (ii) produced in Montana or processed in Montana and that contain a percentage of Montana-produced |
| 26 | ingredients equal to at least 50%; and |
| 27 | (iii) used in meals that are part of the United States department of agriculture's national school lunch |
| 28 | program. |
| 29 | (b) A school district that receives money for the procurement of Montana food products as provided in |

| 1 | (i) shall use the money to purchase foods produced in Montana or processed in Montana that contain |
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| 2 | a percentage of Montana-produced ingredients equal to at least 50%; and |
| 3 | (ii) may not use the money to supplant purchases of food products with federal money, but may use the |
| 4 | money to pay for the difference in cost between food products that are of higher quality and food products that |
| 5 | are allowed to be purchased with federal money. |
| 6 | (4) For the portion of a grant that is allocated for educational activities, a school district shall use the |
| 7 | money for costs directly associated with the educational activities, including staff time, travel costs, and equipment |
| 8 | purchased for the activities. |
| 9 | (5) The office of public instruction shall consult with the Montana department of agriculture to determine |
| 10 | the recipients and amounts of grants awarded under this section. Preference must be given to school districts |
| 11 | that: |
| 12 | (a) propose farm-to-school projects that: |
| 13 | (i) are well designed; |
| 14 | (ii) incorporate positive changes in food purchasing; |
| 15 | (iii) promote healthy food activities; |
| 16 | (iv) have clear educational objectives; |
| 17 | (v) involve parents or the community; and |
| 18 | (vi) have high potential for job creation; |
| 19 | (b) represent a variety of sizes and geographic locations; and |
| 20 | (c) serve a high percentage of children who qualify for free or reduced-price school meals under the |
| 21 | United States department of agriculture's national school lunch program. |
| 22 | (6) The office of public instruction shall award at least two grants under this section during each |
| 23 | biennium. |
| 24 | (7) The office of public instruction shall develop rules and standards related to the grants and may |
| 25 | consult with the department of agriculture with respect to development of those rules and standards. |
| 26 | (8) The office of public instruction may expend no more than 2% of all money received for the grant |
| 27 | program for administrative costs. |
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| 29 | NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$300,000 from the general fund to |
| 30 | the office of public instruction for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as a one-time appropriation to commence |
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| 1 | operation of the farm-to-school grant program under [section 1]. |
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| 3 | NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an |
| 4 | integral part of Title 20, chapter 10, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 10, apply to [section 1]. |
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| 6 | NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2013. |
