4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE MONTANA INDIAN LANGUAGE
5	PRESERVATION PILOT PROGRAM; PROVIDING A PROGRAM DESCRIPTION; PROVIDING RULEMAKING
6	AUTHORITY; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND A TERMINATION DATE."

8	WHEREAS, Montana is committed in its educational goals to the preservation of American Indian cultural
9	integrity; and
10	WHEREAS, language in the form of spoken, written, or sign language is foundational to cultural integrity;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, Montana tribal languages are in a time of crisis through the loss of native speakers, writers,
13	and signers; and
14	WHEREAS, the tribes and the state have resources, such as the tribal colleges, councils, and historic
15	preservation offices and the state universities, historical society, and library, to preserve and protect Montana
16	tribal languages for this and future generations.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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20	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Montana Indian language preservation pilot program. (1) There is a
21	Montana Indian language preservation pilot program. The program is established to support efforts of Montana
22	tribes to preserve Indian language in the form of spoken, written, or sign language AND TO ASSIST IN THE
23	PRESERVATION AND CURRICULAR GOALS OF INDIAN EDUCATION FOR ALL PURSUANT TO ARTICLE X, SECTION 1(2), OF THE
24	MONTANA CONSTITUTION AND TITLE 20, CHAPTER 1, PART 5. PROGRAM ELEMENTS MAY INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED
25	<u>TO:</u>
26	(A) LANGUAGE CLASSES;
27	(B) AUDIO AND VISUAL RECORDINGS;
28	(C) LANGUAGE IMMERSION CAMPS;
29	(D) CREATION OF DICTIONARIES;
30	(E) STORYTELLING; AND

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1	(F) PUBLICATION OF LITERATURE.
2	(2) THE STATE-TRIBAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION ESTABLISHED IN 90-1-131 SHALL ADMINISTER
3	THE PROGRAM AND, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE MONTANA HISTORICAL SOCIETY, THE STATE DIRECTOR OF INDIAN
4	AFFAIRS, AND EACH TRIBAL GOVERNMENT LOCATED ON THE SEVEN MONTANA RESERVATIONS AND THE LITTLE SHELI
5	CHIPPEWA TRIBE, ESTABLISH RULES AND GUIDELINES FOR THE PROGRAM.
6	(2)(3) The office of public instruction STATE-TRIBAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION shall distribute
7	any funding appropriated for this purpose to tribal councils in proportion to the ANB of schools located on the
8	reservations EQUALLY TO EACH TRIBAL GOVERNMENT LOCATED ON THE SEVEN MONTANA RESERVATIONS AND TO THE
9	LITTLE SHELL CHIPPEWA TRIBE.
10	(3)(4) Tribal eouncils GOVERNMENTS are encouraged to form partnerships among state and tribal entities
11	for the purpose of preserving Indian languages and educating all Montanans in a way that honors the cultural
12	integrity of American Indians. These entities include but are not limited to:
13	(A) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS:
14	(a)(B) school districts located on reservations;
15	(b)(C) tribal colleges;
16	(c)(D) tribal historic preservation offices;
17	(d)(E) tribal language and cultural programs;
18	(e)(F) units of the Montana university system;
19	(f)(G) the Montana historical society;
20	(g) (<u>н)</u> the office of public instruction;
21	(h)(I) school districts not located on reservations; and
22	(i)(J) the Montana state library.
23	(4)(5) Tribal councils GOVERNMENTS receiving program funds shall form program advisory boards
24	Members of the boards may include but are not limited to representatives from any of the entities listed in
25	subsection (3) (4). The advisory board shall adopt guiding principles for the program and shall report on program
26	efforts to the state-tribal relations committee.
27	(5)(6) The state-tribal relations committee shall report any findings, comments, or recommendations
28	regarding the program to the 64th legislature.
29	(6)(7) All Any cultural and intellectual property rights from program efforts remain with the tribe BUT MAY

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BE NEGOTIATED BETWEEN THE TRIBE AND OTHER PARTNERING ENTITIES.

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NEW SECTION. Section 2. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a
copy of [this act] to each tribal government located on the seven Montana reservations and to the Little Shell
Chippewa tribe.
COORDINATION SECTION. Section 3. Coordination instruction. If House Bill No. 2 is passed and
approved and does not contain an appropriation to implement the program described in [section 1], then [this act]
is void.
NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
NEW SECTION. Section 5. Termination. [This act] terminates June 30, 2015.

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
