Definitions.** For the purposes of [sections 1 through 1011], unless otherwise stated, the following definitions apply: 13 (1) "Authority only" means approval provided by the legislature to expend money that does not require an appropriation, including grants, 14 donations, auxiliary funds, proprietary funds, and university funds. 15 (2) "Capital project" means the acquisition of land or improvements or the planning, capital construction, environmental cleanup, renovation, furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in [sections 1 through 10 11]. 16 17 (3) "LRBP" means the long-range building program account in the capital projects fund type. 18 (4) "Other funding sources" means money other than LRBP money, state special revenue fund, or federal special revenue money that accrues to an agency under the provisions of law. 19 20 (5) "SBECP funds" means funds from the state building energy conservation program account in the capital projects fund type. 21

(2) The \$400,000 of LRBP funds contained in subsection (1) for the replacement of the Malta readiness center must be utilized for the acquisition of land for the facility. The appropriation of \$15,000,000 of federal special revenue funds for this project is contingent upon the department of military affairs completing the acquisition of land by June 30, 2015. If land is not acquired by this date, the \$400,000 reverts to the general fund.



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(3) Up to \$600,000 of any unexpended or unemcumbered funds approved for the construction of low side units at Montana state prison contained in subsection (1) may be reappropriated for the renovation of laundry facilities at Montana state prison project contained in [section 3] upon final acceptance of the low side units. 3 4 5 NEW SECTION. NEW SECTION. Section 6. Planning and design. The department of administration may proceed with the planning and design of capital projects prior to the receipt of other funding sources. The department may use interentity loans in accordance with 17-2-107 to pay planning and design costs incurred before the receipt of funding from another funding source.

NEW SECTION. Section 7. Capital projects -- contingent funds. If a capital project is financed in whole or in part with appropriations contingent upon the receipt of funding from another funding source, the department of administration may not let the project for bid until the agency has submitted a financial plan for approval by the director of the department of administration. A financial plan may not be approved by the director if:

- (1) the level of funding provided under the financial plan deviates substantially from the funding level provided in [section 2] for that project; or
- (2) the scope of the project is substantially altered or revised from the preliminary plans presented for that project in the 2015 biennium long-range building program presented to the 63rd legislature.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Section 8. Review by department of environmental quality.** The department of environmental quality shall review capital projects authorized in [section 2] for potential inclusion in the state building energy conservation program under Title 90, chapter 4, part 6. When a review shows that a capital project will result in energy improvements, that project must be submitted to the energy conservation program for funding consideration. Funding provided under the energy conservation program guidelines must be used to offset or add to the authorized funding for the project, and the amount will be dependent on the annual utility savings resulting from the facility improvement. Agencies must be notified of potential funding after the review.

- NEW SECTION. Section 9. Capital project grants to local governments -- appropriations. (1) Effective July 1, 2013, the following amounts are appropriated to the department of commerce from the general fund:
- 20 (A) \$403,240 FOR A GRANT OF UP TO \$403,240 TO THE CITY OF BROWNING FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE BROWNING FIRE HALL; AND
- 21 (B) \$2 MILLION FOR A GRANT OF UP TO \$2 MILLION TO THE CITY OF KALISPELL FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO THE KIDSPORTS COMPLEX.



1	(2) FUNDS ARE RESTRICTED TO USE FOR THE PROJECTS AND ARE PAYABLE AS REIMBURSEMENTS.
2	(3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT RULES FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THESE FUNDS.
3	(4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT ON THE PROGRESS ON THE PROJECTS TO THE 2015 LONG-RANGE PLANNING SUBCOMMITTEE.
4	(5) ANY FUNDS NOT REQUIRED FOR THE COMPLETION OF THESE PROJECTS MUST REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND UPON COMPLETION OF THE PROJECTS.
5	
6	NEW SECTION. Section 10. Fund transfer. The department of administration shall transfer the amount of \$16,300,000 from the state general
7	fund to the long-range building program account in the capital projects fund type by June 30, IN FISCAL YEAR 2014.
8	
9	NEW SECTION. Section 11. Legislative consent. The appropriations authorized in [sections 1 through 9 10] constitute legislative consent for
10	the capital projects contained in [sections 1 through 9 10] within the meaning of 18-2-102.
11	
12	NEW SECTION. Section 12. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect.
13	If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid
14	applications.
15	
16	NEW SECTION. Section 13. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
