10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
11	
12	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of [sections 1 through 1011 12 10], unless otherwise stated, the following definitions
13	apply:
14	(1) "Authority only" means approval provided by the legislature to expend money that does not require an appropriation, including grants,
15	donations, auxiliary funds, proprietary funds, and university funds.
16	(2) "Capital project" means the acquisition of land or improvements or the planning, capital construction, environmental cleanup, renovation,
17	furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in [sections 1 through 10 <u>11</u> <u>12</u> <u>10</u>].
18	(3) "LRBP" means the long-range building program account in the capital projects fund type.
19	(4) "Other funding sources" means money other than LRBP money, state special revenue fund, or federal special revenue money that accrues
20	to an agency under the provisions of law.
21	(5) "SBECP funds" means funds from the state building energy conservation program account in the capital projects fund type.

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Transfer of appropriations. The Except for the fish, wildlife, and parks grant to the city of Missoula, the

15 department of fish, wildlife, and parks and the department of transportation are authorized to transfer the appropriations and authority in [sections 3 and

16 4], as appropriate, among the necessary fund types for these projects.

17

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Planning and design. The department of administration may proceed with the planning and design of capital projects 19 prior to the receipt of other funding sources. The department may use interentity loans in accordance with 17-2-107 to pay planning and design costs 20 incurred before the receipt of funding from another funding source.

1	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Capital projects contingent funds. If a capital project is financed in whole or in part with appropriations contingent
2	upon the receipt of funding from another funding source, the department of administration may not let the project for bid until the agency has submitted
3	a financial plan for approval by the director of the department of administration. A financial plan may not be approved by the director if:
4	(1) the level of funding provided under the financial plan deviates substantially from the funding level provided in [section 2] for that project; or
5	(2) the scope of the project is substantially altered or revised from the preliminary plans presented for that project in the 2015 biennium long-range
6	building program presented to the 63rd legislature.
7	
8	NEW SECTION. Section 7. Review by department of environmental quality. The department of environmental quality shall review capital
9	projects authorized in [section 2] for potential inclusion in the state building energy conservation program under Title 90, chapter 4, part 6. When a review
10	shows that a capital project will result in energy improvements, that project must be submitted to the energy conservation program for funding consideration.
11	Funding provided under the energy conservation program guidelines must be used to offset or add to the authorized funding for the project, and the amount
12	will be dependent on the annual utility savings resulting from the facility improvement. Agencies must be notified of potential funding after the review.
13	
14	NEW SECTION. Section 8. Conditions of projects. The legislature authorizes construction of the Butte-Silver Bow emergency
15	OPERATIONS CENTER, TO BE OCCUPIED AND OPERATED BY THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF BUTTE-SILVER BOW IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE BUTTE JUSTICE
16	CENTER, IF A LONG-TERM LEASE AGREEMENT IS SIGNED BETWEEN THE STATE OF MONTANA AND THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF BUTTE-SILVER BOW ENSURING
17	PAYMENT OF ALL OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE COSTS OF THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF BUTTE-SILVER BOW FOR ITS PORTION OF THE FACILITY FOR THE
18	LIFE OF THE BUILDING, UNTIL THE TERM OF THE LEASE IS ALTERED, OR UNTIL THE BUILDING IS SOLD.
19	
20	NEW SECTION. Section 10. Capital project grants to local governments Appropriations. (1) Effective July 1, 2013, the following
21	AMOUNTS ARE APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE FROM THE GENERAL FUND:



1	(A) \$403,240 FOR A GRANT OF UP TO \$403,240 TO THE CITY OF BROWNING FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE BROWNING FIRE HALL; AND
2	(B) \$2 MILLION FOR A GRANT OF UP TO \$2 MILLION TO THE CITY OF KALISPELL FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO THE KIDSPORTS COMPLEX.
3	(2) FUNDS ARE RESTRICTED TO USE FOR THE PROJECTS AND ARE PAYABLE AS REIMBURSEMENTS.
4	(3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT RULES FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THESE FUNDS.
5	(4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT ON THE PROGRESS ON THE PROJECTS TO THE 2015 LONG-RANGE PLANNING SUBCOMMITTEE.
6	(5) ANY FUNDS NOT REQUIRED FOR THE COMPLETION OF THESE PROJECTS MUST REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND UPON COMPLETION OF THE PROJECTS.
7	
8	NEW SECTION. Section 9. Fund transfer. The department of administration shall transfer the amount of $\frac{16,300,000}{91,800,000}$
9	from the state general fund to the long-range building program account in the capital projects fund type by June 30, IN FISCAL YEAR 2014.
10	
11	NEW SECTION. Section 10. Legislative consent. The appropriations authorized in [sections 1 through 9 10 11 9] constitute legislative consent
12	for the capital projects contained in [sections 1 through 9 10 11 <u>9]</u> within the meaning of 18-2-102.
13	
14	NEW SECTION. Section 11. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect.
15	If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid
16	applications.
17	
18	NEW SECTION. Section 12. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
