13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

15	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriations for renewable resource grants. (1) There is appropriated	
16	from the natural resources projects state special revenue account established in 15-38-302 to the department	
17	of natural resources and conservation up to:	
18	(a) \$100,000 \$350,000 to be used for emergency projects <u>AS FOLLOWS:</u>	
19	(I) \$100,000 FOR EMERGENCY PROJECTS to be awarded by the department over the course of the	
20	biennium; AND	
21	(II) \$250,000 FOR THE TEN MILE/PLEASANT VALLEY SEWER DISTRICT;	
22	(b) \$1,062,000 to be used for planning grants to be awarded by the department over the course of the	
23	biennium;	
24	(c) \$300,000 to be used for irrigation development grants to be awarded by the department over the	
25	course of the biennium;	
26	(d) \$100,000 to be used for water project private grants to be awarded by the department over the course	
27	of the biennium;	
28	(e) \$200,000 to be used for development of the state water plan; and	
29	(f) \$200,000 to be used for grants to build organizational capacity; AND	
30	(G) \$1,273,686 to be used for five grants to Jefferson County for the following Big

- 2 (I) LANDOWNER #24 RANCH CHANNEL RESTORATION, \$760,500;

7 (2) There is appropriated from the natural resources projects state special revenue account established 8 in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation \$6,761,983 <u>\$8,967,632</u> for grants to 9 political subdivisions and local governments during the biennium ending June 30, 2015. The funds referred to 10 in this subsection must be awarded by the department to the named entities for the described purposes and in 11 the grant amounts listed in subsection (4), subject to the conditions set forth in [sections 1 through 4] and the 12 contingencies described in the renewable resource grant and loan program January 2013 report to the 63rd 13 legislature. The legislature, pursuant to 85-1-605, approves the grants listed in subsection (4).

(3) Funds must be awarded up to the amounts approved in subsection (4) in the following order of
priority. Funds not accepted or used by these projects may be provided for any renewable resource programs
projects authorized under this section or for reclamation and development program projects authorized by the
63rd legislature in House Bill No. 7. If at any time a grant sponsor determines that a project will not begin before
June 30, 2015, the sponsor shall notify the department of natural resources and conservation.

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1	(5) To the entities listed in this section, this appropriation constitutes a valid obligation of these funds for
2	purposes of encumbering the funds during the biennium ending June 30, 2015, pursuant to 17-7-302.
3	
4	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Coordination of fund sources for grants to political subdivisions and
5	local governments. A project sponsor listed under [section 1(4)] may not receive funds from both the reclamation
6	and development grants program and the renewable resource grant and loan program for the same project during
7	the same biennium.
8	
9	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Condition of grants. Disbursement of funds under [sections 1 through 4]
10	for grants is subject to the following conditions that must be met by project sponsors:
11	(1) approval of a scope of work and budget for the project by the department of natural resources and
12	conservation. Changes in the project scope of work or budget that reduce the public or natural resource benefits
13	as presented in department reports and applicant testimony to the 63rd legislature may result in a proportional
14	reduction in the grant amount.
15	(2) satisfactory completion of conditions described in the recommendation section of the project narrative
16	of the renewable resource grant and loan program report to the legislature for the biennium ending June 30, 2015,
17	or, in the case of grants issued under [section 1(1)], completion of conditions specified at the time of written
18	notification of approved grant authority;
19	(3) execution of a grant agreement with the department; and
20	(4) accomplishment of other specific requirements considered necessary by the department to meet the
21	purpose of the grant as evidenced from the application to the department or from the proposal to the legislature.
22	
23	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Appropriations established. For any entity of state government that
24	receives a grant under [sections 1 through 3], an appropriation is established for the amount of the grant listed
25	in [section 1(4)]. Grants to entities from prior bienniums are reauthorized for completion of contract work.
26	
27	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Transfer of funds. By July 15, 2013, the state treasurer shall
28	TRANSFER TO THE NATURAL RESOURCES PROJECTS STATE SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT ESTABLISHED IN 15-38-302:
29	(1) \$3,473,686 FROM THE GENERAL FUND; AND
30	(2) \$250,000 FROM THE ORPHAN SHARE STATE SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT ESTABLISHED IN 75-10-743.

2	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a
3	copy of [this act] to each tribal government located on the seven Montana reservations and to the Little Shell
4	Chippewa tribe.
5	
6	NEW SECTION. Section 7. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are severable
7	from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part
8	remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.
9	
10	NEW SECTION. Section 8. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2013.
